# **KAI SHARE**

- Kai share provides food boxes for families and people in need, in conjunction with Kiwi Harvest.
- Over 50,000kg rescued food from Kiwi Harvest since the program started.
- Over 100,000 meals
- 35 families weekly being helped
- Kai Share has been reset to better serve our community and their needs.



# Valley Kai

- Creation of the Seed Library in the Valley,
  Preserving workshop in The Valley at Baptist
  - Community Centre
- Korero with local food growing groups,
- Local Food Planning Hui,
- Food Resilience Community Feedback Survey Posters in the community rooms and online
- Worked alongside Our Food Network for a Community Fruit Harvest from January - April.
   Volunteers pickers were matched with households with excess fruit on the trees.
- Over 1.25kg fruit redistributed, and 240L of apple/pear juice at the Harvest.
- Monthly contributions in The Valley Voice.

- We have just been gifted some money towards buying an e-mower but will need to find the remainder, looking at doing some show and tell with Rotary, Lions etc




## **Dalmore Community Garden**

It was a good year in the garden on the hill with the best view in town! We're just a small crew of 4 regular gardeners looking after a large area which is very open and catches all the wind from the south. Keith has put in more raised beds which make it easier for us to manage, and we've got growing numbers of fruit and berry trees and bushes in the space which we hope will be enjoyed for many years as they grow. Any excess are taken to the food pataka by Pinehill School. It was great during summer to see the vege crops others have put there too from their gardens. This year we'd like to put in dwarf fruit trees so will look at trying to get some funding for that. The reserve is looking great with the garden out front and the work of the Dalmore Reserve Wilding crew and it is awesome to see so many people using the area. Ahakoa he iti - he pounamu!

# Valley Counselling Service

- Open since 2020, 100 clients seen, over 700 client hours.
  - Primarily from Northern Dunedin
  - Majority using the service are students, part time workers, people with sickness or Disability. 0.1% of income fee working well. Clients often express recognition of the value of the service offered to them while still being able to pay an affordable fee.
- Recent addition of ACC accredited work.
- Location at Project Rooms accessible, friendly.
- Becoming known amongst Dunedin NGOs and referrers with increasing incidence of

word-of-mouth referrals. The service is meeting need.
