A shed: not just for blokes

The North Dunedin Shed, a community project aimed at pulling together people with knowledge, skills, tools, equipment and materials, and to be a project production house, has been moving along well. With a small dedicated group of volunteers attending on Saturdays from 10–2 pm, the donated farm shed has been cleared of all firewood and is ready for stage two. It is amazing how much has been done over the winter to get to this stage.

Volunteers have been diligently working on all aspects of the planning required to settle and secure the venue. They have formed subcommittees, some to guide the relocation and renovation of the house, and the construction of the shed walls and the roof. Other committees are looking into waste management, the connection of services, landscaping, and the interior design of the house. Still others are exploring the layout of the workshop for storage, materials, tools and equipment, as well as dust extraction and the administration of the ongoing work.

August saw the last of the firewood removed and the water blaster brought in to clean down the walls in preparation for painting. Stage 2 is the laying of the concrete floor and the relocation of the house onto the site ready for renovation. We aim to have the walls cleaned down, the crushed concrete spread and compacted, the concrete slabs laid for the floor and the house relocated onto site by the end of September. It will be a landmark occasion when this occurs.

We want to recognise that over the next twelve months there will be many aspects of this project that will require diverse skills and knowledge in order to make it all work. If you have such skills and would be willing to support this amazing community venture, please contact us. We meet at the Shed at the end of Bonnington Street, Normanby, just over the Lindsay Creek bridge, every Saturday from 10 am. Bring good boots and gloves; all other things provided.






with great success. Success later on also for Preens Drycleaners with my uniform.





Cosy home flash mob

Over the last six months the North East Valley Community Development Project has been looking into ways to help people in the Valley to get warmer and drier homes.

The Valley Project's 'Cosy Homes' committee helped to fund three members of the community to become Home Performance Assessors (HPA), and contributed a small amount for these people to go out and assess homes in the Valley. The HPA gave a full report about how residents in the Valley can make their homes more efficient and solve problems such as condensation and heat loss.

Many people in the community phoned or dropped into the Community Rooms requesting assistance to make their homes warmer and drier. Where criteria applied, we directed people to government schemes for free insulation and/or took details for free window film provided by the Valley Project. We are currently in the process of going through the list, starting with those most in need and unable to apply their own film for various reasons. An amazing group of community volunteers

dubbed the 'Cosy Home Flash Mob' went out in groups to install window film in those households, as well as doing other small DIY tasks that would prevent heat escaping, such as installing draught-excluding foam and door draught-stops, and patching small holes.

The door draught-stops were made and donated by Stepping Stones Otago. The Cosy Home Flash Mob quickly learnt from the first few windows how to cover them most efficiently and effectively. Those who have been helped and are able have offered to return the favour.

This has created a lovely community of neighbours helping neighbours and getting to know each other. Those families able to install their own window film are now being offered free packs as these become available.

Many households have commented on what a difference it made to the warmth and dryness in their homes. One mother commented that her children used to prefer to be outside as it was mostly warmer than in their house. They now are happy their house is warm!


