

"The Share Your Space concept allows parents to book for just two or three hours which most find is enough time to get a considerable amount of work done".



## New home 'perfect' for Naphtali

**SWIMMING IN** the wave pool is back on the programme for Kenny and Simon, who are part of a small group of the Dunedin community who can't speak and who attend a day-programme for disabled adults in North East Valley.

The Pact Group Charitable Trust (Pact) runs the government-funded Naphtali day- programme which moved to a new site at the back of the Salvation Army hall on North Rd in June.

Pact Deputy Chief Executive Officer Paul Chamberlain says the new premises are perfect and are handy to the Dunedin Botanic Garden and shops.

Activity support worker David Gallagher says the programme supports up to 12 disabled adults with activities, walks and van outings. "It's like a school really."

Swimming re-started last month. Kenny, who is in a wheelchair, and Simon were in the pool with David and another carer for about 20 minutes, he says. "They laughed a lot."

David has been working at the programme for four years, after two years being unemployed. "It feels good to do this [job]."

The weekday programme is a free service to people who are diagnosed with an intellectual disability. They are referred by a needs assessor at AccessAbility, an independent

agency contracted to the Ministry of Health and Southern District Health Board.

The Naphtali day-programme also has strong community involvement in North East Valley. The group delivers the Valley Voice around businesses and homes on the flat in the south end of the valley, and in Pine Hill, all on a voluntary basis. ## Grandmother inspires love of needlework

This month's Northern Artery Pop-up Gallery artist Kate Grace shares her love of needlework and sewing learned from her grandmother.

**OF THE** many sensory delights that brightened my days as a little girl, my grand mother's ill-lit attic holds a very special place. It hosted an enormous wardrobe filled with the scent of cedar and lavender.

Together with piles of carefully ironed and folded embroidered linen, there hid sepia photographs of nameless ancestors in their finest Sunday dress, aluminium pre-war currency of no value, and the faded wax flowers of an orange wedding crown preciously wrapped in silk paper.

Here was a sewing box with an array of needles, fine and mysterious tools, unmatched pearl buttons. There were the war medals of my late grandfather, and everywhere many other memories.

I remember the heavy wool of the nun's habit. I remember the coarse touch of the burlap protecting the rabbits' cages in winter. I remember the intricate lace of the stiff coifs of the elderly ladies in Brittany.

I remember the fluid drape of the op shop Victorian linen nightshifts we (teenage girls) used to wear as 70s dresses.

I remember the confusing meanders of my mother's sewing patterns.

I silently observed hands creating magic out of needle and thread. Making was no mystery to the women surrounding me and I am grateful for their gift.

## New yoga class will build strength

**EXPECT TO** sweat and build up core strength and stamina at a new yoga class starting at the Valley Project community rooms this month.

Valley resident Carla Mulder, an experienced practitioner and certified instructor, will teach vinyasa (linking poses together in a flow) yoga from 5.30–6.45pm on Monday and Thursday nights.

Her classes will start with a gentle warm up before moving into a range of poses including one or two challenging ones, back-bends and twists and finishing with a savasana, a full body relaxation, she says.

Carla, who is a mother to two young children, a geography teacher and a relief school teacher, started doing yoga six years ago. She has been teaching at Hot Yoga Dunedin for the past year. Working for herself and teaching yoga more often has been the catalyst for starting her own classes, she says. "It's quite a risk for me."

She is a bit nervous because she has always worked in secure jobs teaching in schools, she says. The idea of having classes at least twice a week is so people can see their body change and become more flexible and stronger, she says. # Speed and school bus concerns on North Rd

I WILL KICK off this column with a timely reminder about speed, in particular down North Rd. It should be no surprise to readers that the limit is 50kph, but, realistically, this is not al-

ways possible due to the build-up of traffic at peak times, road works or, most recently, the replacement of power poles.

I will now add into the mix three child care centres, three schools and a sizable retirement home that drivers need to be constantly aware of. A pedestrian will always come off second best in a collision.

Your speed must not exceed 20kph when you pass a parked bus with 'school ' signs displayed, in <u>both</u> directions. I know I have cracked on about this before but I keep getting the "stunned mullet" look when I stop drivers for this offence, with some not

having seen the school bus at all.

There have been recent incidents of tagging in most if not all schools in the area, with some offenders located and issued with trespass notices.

If your kids are skate boarding or scootering in school playgrounds after hours, especially if it is a school they do not attend, please remind them that they need to respect the fact they are allowed onto the grounds and treat it as a privilege, not a right.

I will have no problem dealing with anyone caught doing graffiti or wilfully damaging property at these locations.

Last but not least, as per my last article, if you wish to start a Neighbourhood Support group in your street I have dropped packs off to the Valley Project or you can con-



IT'S SEPTEMBER and time for a Valley Spring Clean! So cast your eyes over the rubbish stored on your property.

The Valley Project is hosting a collection point for unwanted paint and e-waste (household only) on Sunday 17 September from 1–4pm.

Last year Love the Lindsay enthusiasts collected two trailer loads of rubbish from the river and banks of the Lindsay. This year the focus for Love the Lindsay (with the help of Keep New Zealand Beautiful) is protecting our awa by ensuring poisons and heavy metals from discarded paint and e-waste don't find their way into the creek via gutters and stormwaters.

So let's get them disposed of properly and keep our drains for rain. Here's what's happening on the 17th:

- Keep clean with Resene and receive new paint for old. Bring in unwanted paint or containers and receive a voucher for a Resene test pot. Disposal for Resene paints is free of charge; other brands cost 25c per litre. All paint must be in its original, correctly labelled container without leaks. NO aerosols, automotive or marine paints. NO poisons or hazardous waste (they're too hard for us to handle).
