Green Island's Big Christmas Market Day: Setting the Street A Buzz



Christmas will have a local ring to it this year, as the Green Island Business Association hopes many will flock to the Green Island Christmas Market Day and support smaller businesses.

In what is a traditionally popular and busy day, the event attracts crowds of over 3000 people each year, filling the Main Street. And this year will be no exception as the market's reputation grows in popularity.

Association president Antony Duthie said the event, which will be held on Saturday, 5th December, would be an opportunity for people to gather and enjoy Christmas shopping, as well as the entertainment from local schools, musicians and street artists.

After a difficult year for many, the market provided something positive for the community, Mr Duthie said.

"It involves the community and brings everybody together and

supports local business. It's a chance for the community to see what's available in and around Green Island.

"We want the community to support local and the businesses are needing that support more than ever after a tough year, some more than others," Mr Duthie said.

The event was months in the planning for organiser, Narelle Stewart, and the Green Island Business Association.

Greater Green Island Community worker Larna McCarthy said the day had something for the whole family.

"Christmas is a significant time of the year because it draws people together. The Green Island Christmas Market Day is one of those events which is full of festive sparkle and community, and each year we are seeing an increasing number attend," Ms McCarthy said.

For the kids we have a free bouncy castle for under 5s, face painting, Santa's grotto, and kid friendly fundraisers from the Schools and kindergartens. For the adults we have a wide range of stalls, such as a variety of crafts, plants and garden accessories, jewellery, toys, clothes, baked goods, preserves and other edibles and much more.



Six years on, but sadly without Samantha, and the picnic event attracts crowds of over 1000 people. Its reputation for a stress-free gathering, with food, music, community and fun has meant that this event attracts people from beyond Greater Green Island.

Organisers, Justine Weatherall and Leanne Stenhouse, are planning the 2020 event, and with the year that has been, they are looking forward to offering a relaxed end to the year.

Mrs Weatherall said the simple concept was still there - "keeping it real and keeping it achievable for us organizing it," and making it a fun and manageable experience for everyone.

"I love that families from our community but also wider just come. It has a really relaxed vibe at that crazy time of year when everyone is trying to round things up for the year. It's really nice to see families come along, sit down and relax and enjoy a couple of hours of community local fun. That's what I like the most," Mrs Weatherall said.

The event received funding and support from the Saddle Hill Community Board, Moyles, the Brighton store, the Green Island Lions, as well as the provision of a stage and sound by Ian Chambers.

With local music and entertainment, (and hopefully a good dose of sunshine), the event enabled people to sit down and enjoy, without a huge tug on the wallet.

"There's no pressure on anyone. If you want to bring your own tea, you can. If you want to buy from the Green Island Lions, you can. Sing if you want to, have a wee boggle or sit and relax in the sun (hopefully)," Mrs Weatherall said.

With the event becoming more and more popular each year, Mrs Weatherall said they were implementing a traffic management plan.

"Once it's rolling it's all good. We haven't had any problems with anyone trying to turn it into a boozy night which is good," she said.

Leanne Stenhouse said the event was a great way to get into the holiday season. "Everyone seems to enjoy the relaxed atmosphere," Ms Stenhouse said.


