

GREEN ISLAND RESOURCE RECOVERY PARK UPGRADE STARTS

State-of-the-art upgrades have begun at the Green Island Resource Recovery Park (GIRRP).

The Dunedin City Council (DCC) made a start in September and expects the project to be complete in late 2029.

At first, work will concentrate on installing services such as water, power, drainage and roading.

You can expect to see excavation for building foundations.

Some pine trees will be removed from the GIRRP site because they are located within the future building footprint of the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) building.

You will also see shingle piled on the MRF footprint. The weight of the shingle is a ground 'preload' preparation. The shingle will be removed just before the MRF concrete pad is poured.

We aim to keep noise and dust to a minimum and construction will take place within normal working hours.

All existing Green Island Landfill and GIRRP public services will continue during the redevelopment, but as work progresses people can expect some directional changes when accessing some public areas.

The DCC's 9 year plan includes \$78 million for the GIRRP upgrade. It will enable us to cease transporting about 5000 tonnes of mixed recycling and 16,000 tonnes of compostable material each year to Timaru for processing. All that processing will be done here instead, reducing transport costs

While the GIRRP is being redeveloped, the adjacent Green Island Landfill will be capped in stages in preparation for its closure around 2029–30.



WHAT'S BEING BUILT:

- **1.** Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) to sort and bale items from yellow-lidded mixed recycling bins for resale.
- **2.** Composting facility for shredded food scraps and garden waste.
- **3.** Upgraded bunkers for recyclable glass sorting and storage.
- **4.** Upgraded transfer station to sort and prepare general waste for transfer to landfill.
- 5. Kerbside collections truck park and office.

- **6.** Construction and demolition waste sorting area.
- **7.** Roads and services such as water and power to new buildings.
- 8. Repositioned green/garden waste drop off area.
