The Green Island Memorial Gardens was turned into a playground construction zone last month, and the anticipation has Green Island School pupil Lena Walker (6) jumping sky high. "I'm very excited," Lena said, of the official opening on Friday, October 12th. Greater Green Island Community Network chairman Steve Hayward, along with the Network committee, is thrilled that the development is underway. "It will be a great focal point for families to gather and get together. We are really excited," he said. The playground would include train-style play equipment for children aged up to 6 years, and had been in the planning for two years. "It's fenced so it's safe. It's going to be using an under utilised area. Everyone has been so positive from the start," Mr Hayward said. "We are looking forward to the next 12 months, focusing on the family seating and the BBQ area." The recreational area is being developed in the Green Island Memorial Gardens, Main South Road.

Kaikorai Valley College

Another reunion of former board, staff and students of Kaikorai Valley College – known by the mature generations as Kaikorai Valley High School is planned for Friday 19th and Saturday 20th October. That is Labour Weekend 2018.

Many changes have occurred in this area of the city during the past six decades. When KVHS accepted the first intake of students in Jan 1958, there was no direct road link to Burnside. Kaikorai Valley Rd terminated at Barr St, and there was a narrow track between high hawthorn hedges that went further down the valley. There were market gardens and Fox's pig farm up the Ammunition Track on the side of Round Hill. The school buildings were not completed in time, so classrooms had to be shared and the staff room became multi-purpose. Under the leadership of Rex Maslin, the first principal, the school earned an excellent reputation. The roll swelled to 1300 students within six years, which meant that there were building trades working at the school for all of the early years. And there were a lot of cold, draughty, prefabricated and portable rooms.

KVHS has celebrated its history with successful reunions at 25, 35, 40, 50 year jubilees. At the 50^{tn} reunion in 2008, there were 1180 people back at the school enjoying the reminiscences from earlier times. Ten years later we will celebrate the 60th year anniversary.

Garden Gossip

Spring is officially here but don't be tempted to get too busy in the garden. It's still a bit cold for wee vegie plants. Save a few 2 or 3L milk or juice containers, cut the bottom off and you have a seed growing container for your lettuces or broccoli,



cauli, or cabbages. Look after your seeds indoors on a sunny windowsill and in about 4-6 weeks plant them in the garden and use the top you cut off the container as a mini glass house to protect them from the weather, the birds and the dreaded slugs and snails. I plant loose leaf lettuces first so we can take leaves off for lunches and the plant keeps growing. If you don't have a garden try growing a few plants in a bucket.
