Following on from last month, the upgrades to the Green Island Playground are still top of mind. We have been successful in our application to the Bendigo Valley Sports and Charity Foundation for some funding towards this project.

We are very grateful to have support from foundations such as these, as they are helping us to grow our community. We are also grateful to the local Commercial Tavern for ensuring that gaming funds are kept in the community, and are available through foundations such as Bendigo.

Based upon feed back from the local community, with some design in mind by Garador Otago and with funding behind us, we will now apply to the Dunedin City Council for consent to construct and install shade sails to protect part of the Playground. This facility will enhance the play ground area and provide protection against the hot sun for the families using this playground.

Brighton Residents Say NO to Rubbish

Brighton residents packed their local hall recently, opposing a proposed landfill for Big Stone Rd, and demanded more community consultation from the Dunedin City Council.

Over 120 residents listened to meeting organiser and Big Stone Rd resident, Sarah Ramsay, Saddle Hill Community Board chairperson Scott Weatherall, DCC acting chief executive Sandy Graham and infrastructure services general manager Simon Drew, and had the opportunity to voice their concerns.

Reservations for the site include: increased traffic, air and land pollution, fire hazards, and potential leaking in the Otokia Stream which flows into Brighton Beach.

Use your vote in the 2020 General Election and Referendums



Most of us are already enrolled and voting – have you joined us? If you haven't, you're giving up your voice on the big issues affecting us all. Only those who are correctly enrolled will get to vote in the 2020 General Election as well as in the End of Life Choice referendum and Cannabis Legalisation and Control referendum.

If you're a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, and have turned 18, you need to be on the electoral roll. And every time you move house, you need to update your details so you're listed at the right address.

Be a part of the decisions that affect you. Voting is a small action, but one that can have a huge effect on you, your family and New Zealand. It's your right to vote.

comparison to hitting another car of pedestrian due to poor vision. Sorry is not going to make things better.

Also a reminder about sunstrike and also if your going up Lookout point to Dunedin and you're stuck behind a slow truck. Stay in the lane as I've attended too many crashes where someone changes from the left lane at 50kmh and into the right lane where traffic is doing 100kmh. The result is multiple nose to tail collisions.

THAI PUMPKIN SOUP

With these chilly winter days upon us, nothing quite beats a good hearty soup – with a bit of kick. Try out one of our family's favourite weekend lunches, and see what you think.

Thai Pumpkin Soup. - Ingredients


- 1 Tbsp Olive Oil
- 1 Onion, chopped finely
- 1 Tbsp brown sugar
- 2 garlic cloves
- 1 medium pumpkin
- 2 cups of water
- 1 can of coconut cream
- 1 or 2 fresh/dried chillis (red)
- 1 Tbsp lemongrass
- 1 Tbsp fish sauce
- Salt and pepper to taste.

Method

Heat oil in a pot. Gently cook onion, sugar and garlic until soft. Add all the other ingredients. Simmer until pumpkin is soft (approximately 20mins). Puree with a whizz stick.

Emerson Street's Grand Unveiling

If you have driven along Emerson Street lately, you will have been struck by a blaze of colour and the groove of music

Artists Claire Rye and Jonny Waters have been working hard and transforming the grey exterior of the public toilet walls into a mural of inspiration.

The two Dunedin artists were successful in their submissions to GGICN and DCC to pursue the project. Mr Waters, who headed the youth project with the Runciman Tunnel Mural, said he was "stoked" to be working on another community project.

Mr Waters said Concord offered the "perfect mix of residential housing and greenery" - and they wanted the mural to reflect that.

And the response from the local community has been very positive, he said.

"We've started having conversations with people who are locals. They are all stoked."

Like any project, there has been months of planning involved.

"There's a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes that people don't realise goes into it," Mr Waters said. But team work helps, as Ms Rye said the pair have worked on a number of youth projects over the past five years.

"We were just really excited to get our designs up. It's the first project where we have done our own designs together," Ms Rye said.

Both artists have been "chipping away" on the mural on Saturdays, as they both have full-time jobs, Monday to Friday.

"It's a pleasure to get these projects where you get to work in such a public place," Ms Rye said.





Community Gardener Marion Claver Thomas said the bulbs are sitting in sawdust and, even though they have already sprouted, they will transplant well.


