# Mid-Winter Matariki Feast at Big Rock



A fantastic term came to an end with a mid-winter Matariki feast held at the Brighton Hall. The term at Big Rock Primary School was a very eventful one with a wide variety of learning experiences and adventures being undertaken. One of the key ones was the Inquiry- based learning topic of 'People and Places-Around the World' in which the children went on personal journeys exploring a wide range of countries and cultures, classes operating travel

agencies, earning travel dollars, even building hot air balloons to travel in. Another hit was an intensive football programme run by Tony Martin in which all of the children had a minimum of nine intensive football lessons. To finish off the busy and challenging term, the school community came back from their travels to share a Matariki feast. About 180 people were involved, and all of the food was locally sourced and donated by families, whanau and friends of the school. On the menu was a full hangi that included lamb, pork and chicken, kumara, pumpkin and potatoes as well as steam puddings and stuffing. Cooked at school, there was also a pig and sheep on a spit, whitebait, blue cod, flounders, a huge trout (11kg)

gurnard, vegetarian lasagna, vegan curry (enjoyed by many), and traditional South African casserole. Much of the food was cooked by the children. The hangi was put down by Dennis Kahui and a very loyal team of workers.. A massive thank you to everyone for donating time and food and for capping a great term off in a magnificent way. Next term promises to be another beauty with our Art Extravaganza involving children, families and whanau.



# Know your way around roundabouts

On average three people are killed and more than 250 are injured each year in crashes at roundabouts. One of the major factors contributing to these crashes is uncertainty – drivers being unsure of what they are meant to do, and what other drivers are intending to do.

There are clear rules in place for how you must signal and use lanes at roundabouts. Make sure you know what to do.

- Before entering a roundabout you must indicate if you are intending to exit left or right (if going straight ahead, don't indicate on entry).
- You must give way to all traffic that will cross your path from your right as you enter the roundabout.
- You then need to signal left as you pass the exit before the one you intend taking.
- At multi-lane roundabouts, you need to approach and enter the roundabout in the correct lane for where you intend to exit.



Give way to all traffic that will cross your path from your right as you enter the roundabout.

### How this works



If you're going left at the first exit, use the left-hand lane (or any other lane marked for that purpose) and signal a left turn before entering. Continue to indicate left as you exit the roundabout.

If you're going straight ahead at the roundabout (eg halfway around), you need to use any lane which is marked for that purpose. You must signal a left turn as you pass the exit before the one you intend to take.





If you are going more than halfway around a multi-lane roundabout, you must approach in the right-hand lane (or any other lane marked for that purpose). You must also signal a right turn when entering the roundabout, then a left turn as you pass the exit before the one you intend to take.

- Carrots, radishes and broad beans can be sown directly into the soil, towards the end of the month.

- For those with greenhouses, now is a good time to plant tomato, chilli and peppers in trays—to be transferred.
- And for those summery salads, start planting lettuce, spinach, silverbeet and brassicas in trays.
