Greater Green Island Recreation Area Now Open For Fun



The weather forecast may have been a little foreboding, but the opening of the Greater Green Island Recreational Area Playground added plenty of sunshine to people's faces. The area dazzled in colour as over 300 people flocked to enjoy the much anticipated opening on the 26th October. Before the ribbons were cut by RSA president Lox Kellas, Green Island Primary School student, Lena, Greater Green Island Committee member, Constable Fred Jansen and Abbotsford Primary School student Leo Reid, the crowd was treated to waiata performances from Green Island Kindergarden and St Peter Chanel School. Committee Chairperson Steve Hayward then spoke of the journey and the delight in seeing the playground (the first stage of the Greater Green Island Recreational Area development) being opened. Mr Pessa Tili, from St Peter Chanel School also made a blessing, before DCC Councilor Rachel Elder spoke of the pride in achieving projects as a community. Special thanks to Fresh Choice Moyles, for providing a free BBQ for everyone. It was also great to see the funders, contributing businesses, community contributors and the playground equipment suppliers at the opening, thank you. to ensure the safety of 0-6 year olds using the playground, especially as it is so close to Main South Road and the carpark of Freshchoice Moyles. A concrete pathway is also being constructed (with bricks that local families and businesses have purchased on the edge) and a BBQ table donated by Night n Day Green Island will be installed. Just when you thought the recre-



ational area couldn't possibly be any better, we have some news for you. The second stage of the Recreational Area is still in the planning phases but the Greater Green Island Community Network are aiming at a BBQ area being developed, a small stage for outdoor performances and a community notice board (which has been kindly made for us by Bruce Cromb of the Green Island Shed). Residents and businesses still have the opportunity to be part of the project, by purchasing a brick —with their names imprinted as recognition. Bricks cost \$80 each. Large tiles 30cmx30cm with logos are also being displayed in the Recreational Area for funders who contribute \$2,000 or more towards the projects. Tips for Zero Waste Living

Minimising your household waste can be a little overwhelming for most at first, but with these easy tips, you will be well on your way to a zero waste lifestyle in no time. The secret is to keep it simple, start small and let the process evolve. You will get better at this as time goes by and you become more creative with different ways to reuse ordinary items you would have once thrown away. Zero waste is so much more then just recycling! Refusing and reusing needs to come first. An easy way to begin is by using reusable shopping bags, not just your groceries but for every time you go shopping to buy something, like that book from the bookstore or new clothes. Next, become mindful of the groceries you buy and the packaging they come in. Reusable produce bags are fantastic for your fruit and veg and are available at most supermarkets these days. Buying all your non perishable food like nuts, flour, herbs and spices, vinegar etc from bulk food stores where you can fill your own containers will make a huge difference to your household waste as will sourcing where you can get milk in refillable glass bottles. Then, any items you just can't live without and can't find in plastic free packaging, make sure you are recycling the packaging at home. Soft plastics can go into the soft packaging bins at most supermarkets, the warehouse and mitre 10's. Spring and summer are a great time to get your own vegie patch going and isn't only good for the environment but great for your health as well having fresh vegies on hand straight from the garden. Composting all your kitchen scraps and even having a worm farm for any additional scraps. The worm juice is a great non toxic tonic for your garden to make it flourish. By Angie Hancock.

Labour Weekend has been a beaut for gardeners. Traditionally the time to get your garden up and growing for the season but don't stress if you haven't. Salad vegies can be planted anytime and if you sow a little bit every few weeks you will always have something ready. Lettuces sown now will be ready in about 6 weeks and radishes even quicker. Experiment a little and try some of the Mesclun or Gourmet salad mixes. We have planted seeds for edible flowers so should have some very pretty salads by Xmas time. The Community Garden has lots of plants for sale.. lettuces, brussels sprouts, tomatoes, cucumbers, courgettes, sunflowers and swan plants. Your soil is the powerhouse of your garden and needs to be looked after. Compost is the best additive and easy to make. Happy gardening. Marion 021 2631221.
