## Accessible Bathroom



One of our Brathwaite Centre students was the first person to use his key fob to open Dunedin's first Changing Places accessible bathroom during the official opening on Friday, 17 April. The bathroom is a true asset for the city and people living with complex care needs. Now people with such needs can use a purpose-built bathroom in the city. The height-adjustable toilet, hand basin, and change table/shower bed allow the facilities

to suit a range of people and their needs.

The bathroom, located beside the Dunedin Railway Station, has artwork that promotes iconic Dunedin history and scenes, such as the Royal albatross, steam train, and the railway station. Our student featured in an Otago Daily Times article about the accessible bathroom (18/4/26). He worked with a Brathwaite Centre teacher aide to discuss and respond to the newspaper article:

*"I like the big story about me at the public bathroom. That's me in my wheelchair. The two ladies (in the ODT photo) are nice and they were happy. I think the change bed will be comfortable. I think the train on the wall can make a noise. It will go, "Toot! Toot!" like my toy. I would like to go on the train with Daddy."*

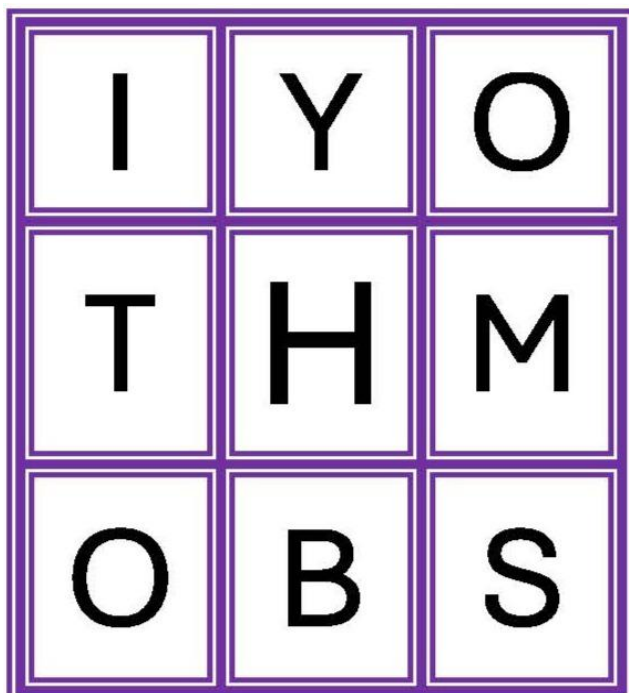
