### PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT



Kia ora koutou

Last weekend, several of our students participated in the Rockquest. All of our students performed exceptionally well, with one of our bands, Riot (Ethan Sinclair, Cody Te Ngahue-Forbes, Lassie Feil, Liam Dick), advancing to the regional finals, and Devine Talosaga Felise Emilio winning the regional competition and now advancing to the national finals. Well done to all our musicians, and special congratulations to those who progress to the next stages of the competition.

You may have seen or read reports in the media about the changes to the secondary school qualifications. The changes take effect from 2028 onwards, meaning that any student currently in Year 9 or below will be working towards the new qualification, while students in Year 10 or above will continue with NCEA. Below is a timeline for implementing the changes.

- 2028 – Foundational Award at Year 11
- 2029 – NZ Certificate of Education (NZCE) at Year 12
- 2030 – NZ Advanced Certificate of Education (NZACE) at Year 13

The changes are substantial, with increased content in each subject and compulsory assessments, including examinations. Within this updated framework, students will be expected to take at least five subjects in Years 12 and 13. To successfully attain each qualification, students will need to pass at least three of these subjects, in addition to meeting the literacy and numeracy requirements established by the Year 11 Foundational Award.

The new certificates will provide an overview of academic achievement by listing specific subjects passed and the corresponding grades. This move away from the current NCEA credit model towards a six-point grading system, ranging from A+ to E, with a minimum of a C required to pass any subject.

The curriculum for Years 7-10 has also been changed, with changes in English and mathematics already implemented at these levels, while changes in other subjects are due to be implemented in 2027. During Terms 3 and 4, we will work towards updating our teaching programmes to align with the curriculum changes in Years 7-10. This will ensure our students are prepared for the new qualification system in 2028 and beyond.

Though the changes were formally announced this past week, we have been putting in place structures and programmes to help students meet the demands of the future qualifications framework. Initiatives such as structured literacy have been implemented in Years 7 and 8, and some Year 9 and 10 English classes. There are literacy and numeracy modules that students can take in Years 9 and 10 (in addition to compulsory English and maths classes) to boost their reading, writing, and mathematics. As you know, we have also initiated a homework programme for all year levels. Studying and reviewing work at home regularly is vital to passing examinations. This is why we initiated a homework policy for all year levels. We want our students to develop good habits of reviewing their work and studying regularly, so that when they do sit high-stakes examinations in Years 11-13, they are accustomed to the extra work and commitment required.

## O-Taiko Japanese Drumming Ensemble

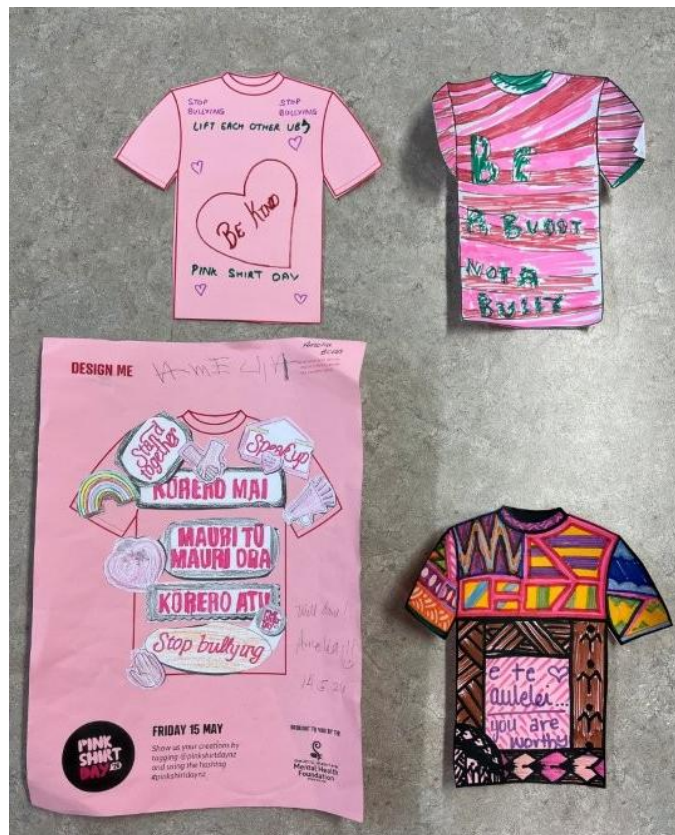
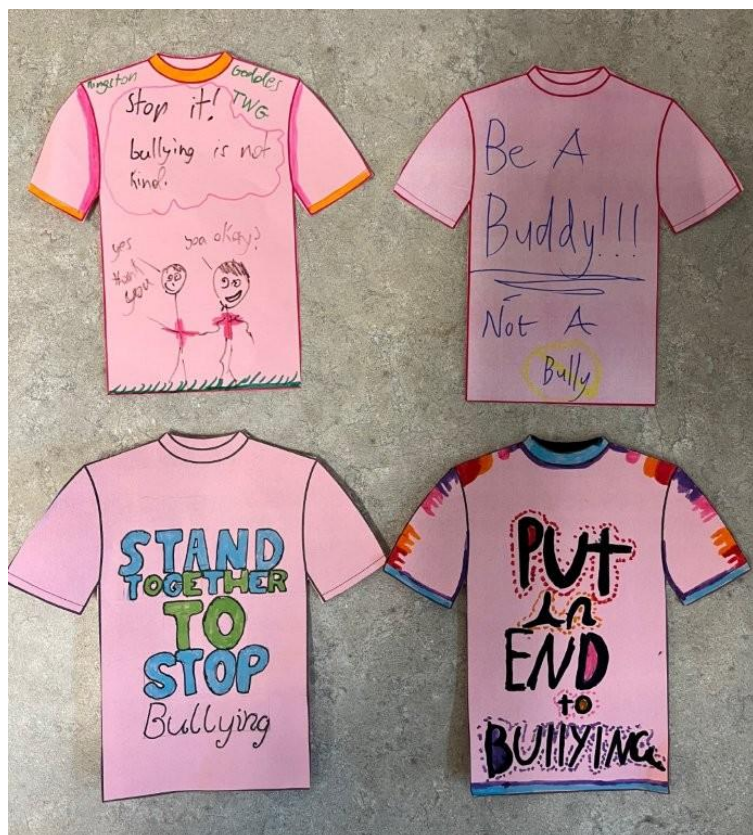
