PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT



Kia ora koutou

As we approach the final few days of the term, we are preparing for the Junior Prize-Giving, which occurs next week, on the last day of term. I have looked over the recipients of the various awards, and as this will be the final newsletter of the year, I would like to congratulate all our award winners in advance. You can all be proud of your achievements. What an outstanding group of young people.

You may have heard or read in the media about the Government's move to remove the requirement for School Boards to give effect to the Treaty of Waitangi. One of our school values is Diversity. We teach students that diversity means being accepting and welcoming, celebrating differences, and trying to understand and value different cultures. It is important to us that students feel welcome, respected, and

comfortable, and that they can express who they are through culture, language, and identity. This will not change.

A school's core purpose is to enable students to achieve personal excellence in academics through quality teaching and high expectations. We are proud to be a school that not only values cultural identity but also pushes students to achieve their best academically. Below, I have included our Māori students' NCEA pass rates compared with the National pass rates over the last five years.

As you can see, our Māori students consistently achieve at or above the national level in most years. We are incredibly proud of the results of our Māori students; they are a testament to their (and their whānau's) hard work and commitment to education. These results also indicate the responsibility, care, and dedication our staff have for our students. However, honouring the Treaty is more than just academic results, and we will continue the work that has been going on for many years to ensure Kaikorai Valley College is a place where Māori can succeed as Māori. We are still dedicated to providing access to Te Reo Māori instruction, even though this requirement has been removed, and to supporting our Kapa Haka to grow. Next year and beyond, the staff



will continue their journey in exploring Te Ao Māori to enhance their understanding and appreciation of local customs, stories, and narratives.

It has been an incredible year. I have enjoyed seeing our students grow, both academically and personally, and I wish to thank all our families/whānau for their continued support, as well as our dedicated staff for making Kaikorai Valley College such a special place. I hope you all have a pleasant break, and we look forward to seeing all our students again in 2026.

To all our students, families, and staff, I wish you a **safe, restful, and rejuvenating holiday period**. Take this time to recharge and enjoy time with loved ones.




PRO-CIVIL

The Kaikorai Valley College Parent Group is a small group that supports the College by:





NEW ZEALAND TRAVELLER DECLARATION

Going overseas for the school holidays? Everyone travelling into New Zealand must complete a New Zealand Traveller Declaration, including returning New Zealand passport holders.

It's FREE, and you can do it on the <u>online form</u> or on the <u>NZTD app.</u>

If you're traveling as a family or group and submitting multiple declarations, the NZTD app lets you copy your travel details into another declaration, simplifying the process of completing several declarations for the same trip. All the submitted declarations are then easy to view within the app.

The New Zealand Traveller Declaration gathers travel, customs, immigration, and biosecurity information and aims to enhance the safety and security of New Zealand. It replaces the paper card you previously filled out on the plane.

To make your arrival easier, do your digital declaration before your flight back to New Zealand. Head to travellerdeclaration.govt.nz today!

Transport Engineering and Road Safety Message Changes to the Speed Limits Outside Schools

The Transport Department is updating variable 30km/h speed limit timeframes outside schools in Dunedin to make them consistent across the city.

Currently, the timeframes are based on different school start and finish times, which can vary between schools.

The change means motorists will have one consistent rule to follow. This aims to improve clarity and reduce confusion and is in line with the Setting of Speed Limits 2024 rule.

From January 2026, the new 30km/h speed limit outside Kaikorai Valley College will apply at the following times:

- ❖ Weekday mornings: 8:00 am to 9:15 am
- Weekday afternoons: 2:45 pm to 3:45 pm

A standard approach across the network will ensure variable speed limits are clearer to motorists, improving the safety of schoolchildren and other road users.

Important information concerning road works in your area

What's being done:

Dunedin City Council - Kaikorai Valley Road Rehabilitation

Location: Southbound lane of Kaikorai Valley Road,

from Bryant Street to Townleys Road (please refer to map on reverse)

Start: Monday 12.01.2026

Duration: 4 months total duration over 3 stages. Each stage will take 5-6 weeks

Typical working hours: Monday - Friday, 7am - 6pm.

Nighttime operations may occur depending on project requirements.

Description: Dunedin City Council has contracted Downer to renew the footpath, kerb and channel, and carriageway from Bryant Street to Townleys Road. Lane shifts will be applied to ensure continuous flow of both directions of traffic, to accommodate excavation, construction

and reinstatement works.



Kaikorai Valley Road is a key route in the Dunedin City Council's roading, cycleway and footpath network and it is important to keep it maintained so that everyone can travel safely to their destination. Downer will be renewing parts of Kaikorai Valley as part of the Dunedin City Council's annual maintenance programme.



Safety

As construction work can create multiple hazard areas, please be aware of the dangers posed by machinery and work sites. Whilst we endeavour to leave the site as tidy and user-friendly as possible, please also be aware that the work area may have uneven surfaces and take care if you need to cross the site. Should you notice anything of concern on our operational sites, we welcome your feedback.



Access

To minimise disruption to all users, the **northbound lane at each stage will be temporarily changed into a two-lane road**, with pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicle traffic redirected onto the new temporary layout while we complete the construction works. **Bus stops** located within the work area **will be relocated outside the site limits** in accordance with the applicable work stage. **Original bus route will still be maintained**.



Parking

Prior to work commencing, we will place no-parking cones in the area we would like left clear to enable our work to be carried out. Please keep your vehicles clear from this area. **Parking on the affected section of Kaikorai Valley Road will be unavailable throughout the work period.**



Disruption

We understand that this type of work can be inconvenient, and due to the nature of the works, there will be some disruption of access to your property. For example, When the kerb and footpath work is occurring directly outside your property, your vehicle access will be unavailable for a short duration. We encourage residents, businesses and interested parties to contact us as soon as possible so we may work with you to minimise any inconvenience.





We want to minimise the impact as much as possible and are consulting on the programme to work in a way that aims to have the least impact to the road users, businesses, and the community.

To facilitate these works, the project will be split into three stages, with each stage being completed before moving onto the next.
