You must bring your own equipment in a clear plastic bag.

- Black or blue pens, ruler, highlighter
- Calculators (NZQA-approved calculator), maximum of two
- Headphones (for language exams and digital exams if you are using text-to-speech)
- Chrome book/laptop digital exams. This must be fully charged.
- You may bring a book to read once you have finished. This must be placed under your desk and cannot be touched until the supervisor has taken your exam papers. (This is only allowable for these school exams only, not the final exams next term)

You may not borrow equipment from another student during the exam.

Calculators

Teachers will clear ALL calculator memories. You may use a calculator in the exam room only if its memory has been cleared. A list of the **approved calculators** and subjects is published on the NZQA website.

Water

Bring a see-through bottle of water to keep hydrated

Clothes

You may wear sensible mufti and appropriate clothing. Remember the hall gets cold! Clothes should not have any writing on them. Hats are not allowed. Bracelets are not allowed, as they bang on the desk and distract others. Pockets must be empty.

Emergency Evacuation Pack

You may take items for an emergency evacuation into the exam room in a clear sealable plastic bag. This pack stays under your chair and must not be touched or opened without the permission of a supervisor. Contents could include: a mobile phone (switched off) or other electronic device (switched off), keys, watch, money, mask or face covering, bus/train pass and medicines.

Examination Rules

- Follow all instructions of any supervisor
- All work you submit for marking must be your own
- You must not bring the following into the exam room:
 - any electronic device unless it is switched off and inside the sealed emergency evacuation pack (an electronic device is anything that can store, communicate and/or retrieve information and includes all cell phones)
 - any paper
 - any notes, in any form
 - any watch of any type (digital or analogue)
- You may not leave the room in the first 45 minutes of the exam
- If you need to go to the toilet more than twice, you will be listed as undertaking unusual behaviour, and your actions may be investigated.
- You must stay for the whole exam time
- When the exam finishes, you must leave the area silently and go home.

In an exam you must not

- talk to, communicate with or disturb other candidates
- copy another candidate's work
- communicate with the marker, including writing or drawing anything that could be viewed as offensive
- You must stay for the whole exam period
- touch or open any emergency evacuation pack without the permission of a supervisor.

Any reported possible breach of the rules will be investigated as per school NZQA procedures

Digital Exams

Before the day of the exam, you must

- Memorise your username and password to use when accessing the digital exam
- **Fully charge your device**
- Check your headphones are compatible with your device, if you are doing a language, or using text to speech.
- Install the target language keyboard on your device (for responses in te reo Māori or the target language for language exams).

On the day of your exam, you must:

- Bring your fully charged device
- Bring your headphones (if you are sitting a language, RAS Dance or Te Reo Rangatira digital exam)
- Bring your fully charged power bank

During the exam, you must:

- Not access the internet on any other site except Assessment Master
- If you move out of the exam window or access other sites, you will be locked out.

At the end of the exam, you must:

- submit your answers as instructed
- hand in note-making paper and ALL answer booklets, where provided

Study Tips

You need to study in a quiet space at home, free from distractions.
Each night, you should study for at least 1.5 hrs.

Active Learning Strategies

- **Test yourself:** Use flashcards or practice quizzes instead of just rereading notes
- **Explain concepts:** Teach the material out loud in your own words as if speaking to someone else.
- **Mix topics:** Cycle through different subjects or types of problems in one session to build better retention.

Time Management and Environment

- **Use intervals:** Study with full focus for 25 minutes, then rest for 5 minutes, repeat
- **Remove distractions:** Put your phone in another room or turn on "Do Not Disturb" mode.
- **Create a space:** Set up a clean, quiet, and well-lit area dedicated only to your schoolwork.

Routine and Well-being

- **Space out sessions:** Study a little bit each day rather than trying to learn everything the night before an exam.
- **Prioritize sleep:** Aim for 7 to 8 hours of sleep each night to help your brain lock in new information.
- **Take breaks:** Step away to walk or hydrate when you feel your focus start to

[LearnCoach](#) is a library of short videos and quizzes for students doing NCEA. It also offers courses for both internals and externals. LearnCoach's strength is simplifying complicated ideas into a format anyone can understand.

Their basic plan is free and offers limited access to their content.

To get unlimited access, the premium version costs. Many of their videos are free to access through their [YouTube](#) channel, so have a look and check it out. LearnCoach is very useful for helping you understand concepts that may not have fully clicked in the classroom.

[Mr Ong Maths Lessons](#) and [infinityplusone](#) are YouTube channels dedicated to helping students with NCEA mathematics - including statistics and calculus. Both these channels teach many concepts and provide worked examples by going through past exams. Trying the questions yourself first, then comparing your answers with the worked examples, will help you understand the best way to think about certain problems and learn where you are prone to mistakes.

[Mr Whibbley](#) and [Andre Sargent](#) are YouTube channels that help with **physics** by walking through NCEA questions. This is a very useful way to learn physics. Try solving the NCEA paper yourself and check your understanding and reasoning by comparing your thought processes with these YouTubers.

[Alpha Atoms](#) is a YouTube channel dedicated to supporting Level 1 Science and Levels 2 and 3 Chemistry.

On this channel, you'll find helpful videos with lessons and tutorials on concepts, walkthroughs of past exemplars, and live Q&A sessions to answer any queries. Going through the past papers yourself, watching the guided videos afterward, and comparing your responses is a beneficial way of seeing what mistakes you made and where you can improve

[Khan Academy](#) produces many videos on **maths, economics, physics, biology, chemistry, finance, history** and much more. Although much of the content is targeted at students studying at a level higher than what is required for NCEA, it is often helpful because it explains more complex concepts that can be hard to wrap your head around. They publish many of their [videos on YouTube](#), and you can access them through their website. They are a nonprofit aiming to provide world-class education for anyone, anywhere.

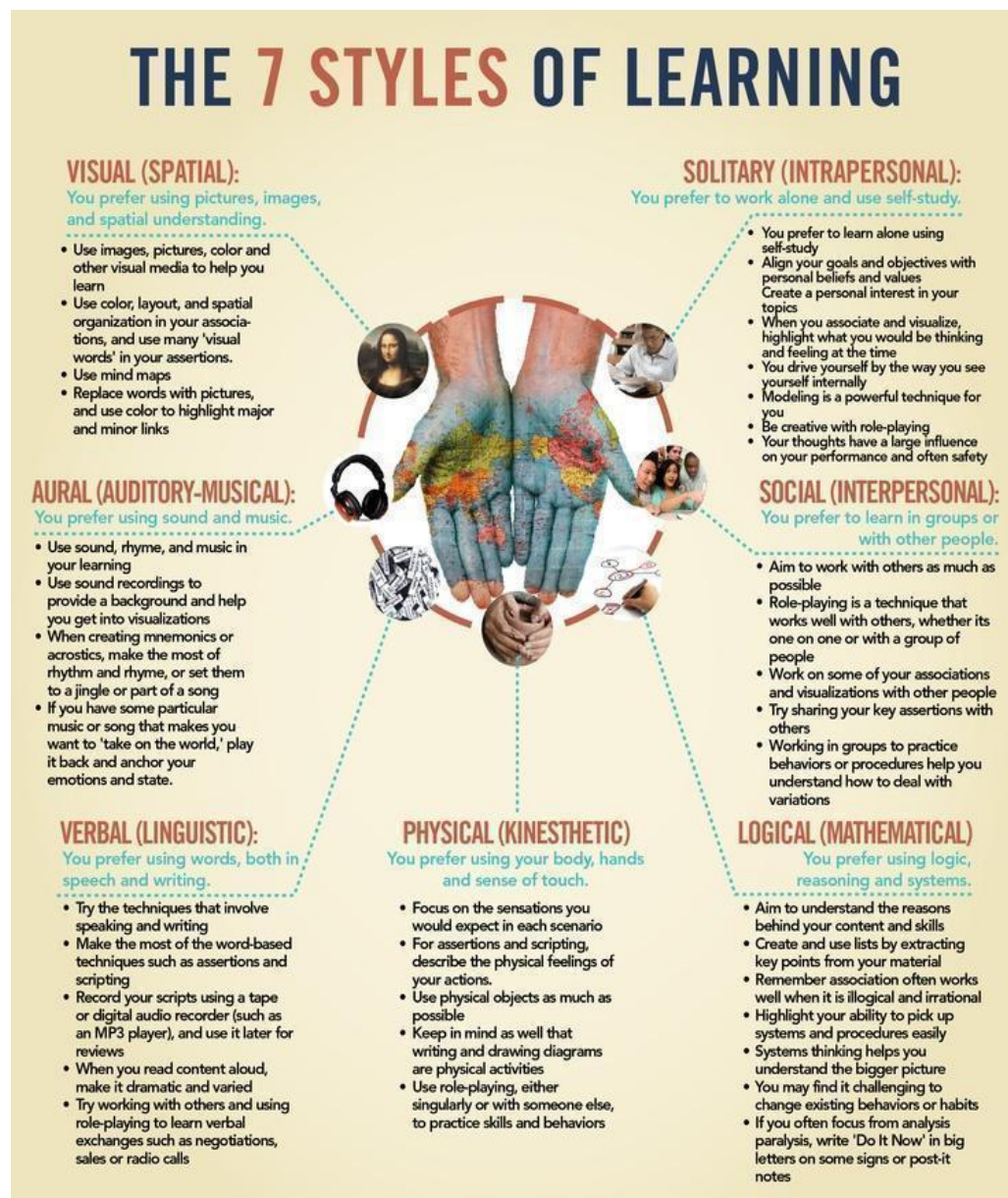

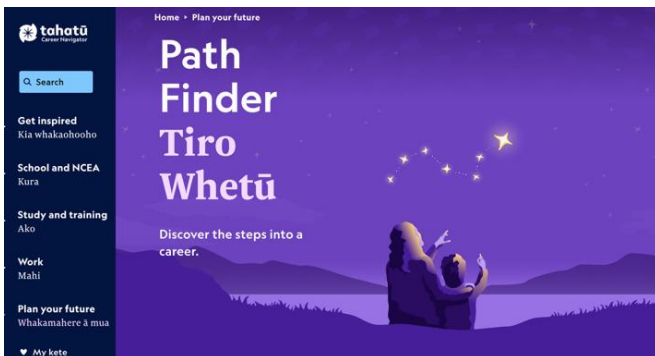

Exploring Career Pathways with Tahatū



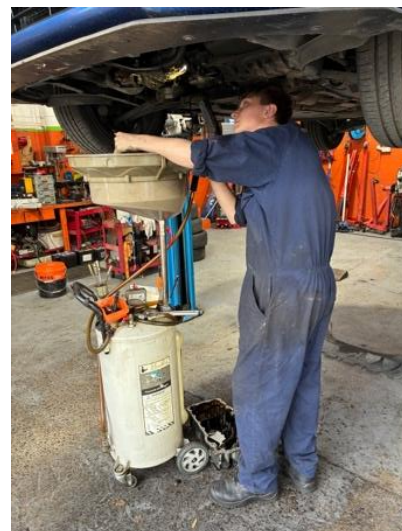
Over the past week, Careers Advisor Mrs Beagley has been working with students in classes to explore career pathways, recommended subjects and prerequisites for future study.

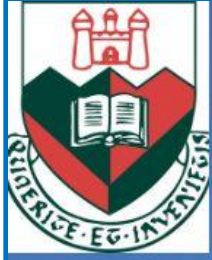
