# Kapa Haka Group Attending the Ngā Manu Kōrero (NMK) Speech Competition

This week, members of the Kapa Haka group attended the Ngā Manu Kōrero (NMK) Speech Competition in support of our Māori leader, Wairangi Tunoho. NMK is more than just a speech competition; it is a place for future Māori leaders to gather and share their opinions and ideas on the revitalisation of Māori language, culture, and all things Māori!

On the first day, schools from around the Otago/Southland region were greeted with karakia, waiata, and welcoming speeches by Southland leaders. After this, the first student speaker took the stage. All the student speakers stood and spoke with mana. There was a mix of kōrero Māori and kōrero English being spoken on a wide range of topics such as “Generation Kotahitanga- Maori youth leading unity” and “Old roots, New energy”.

Kaikorai Valley speaker Wairangi Tunoho was the eighth speaker, and his topic was Generation Kotahitanga: Maori youth leading unity. Being on stage in front of a large audience is a daunting task, and it was great to see Wairangi speak so confidently and professionally. 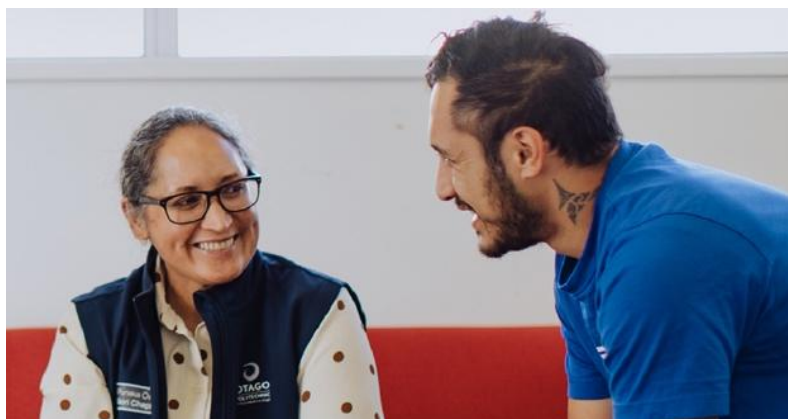

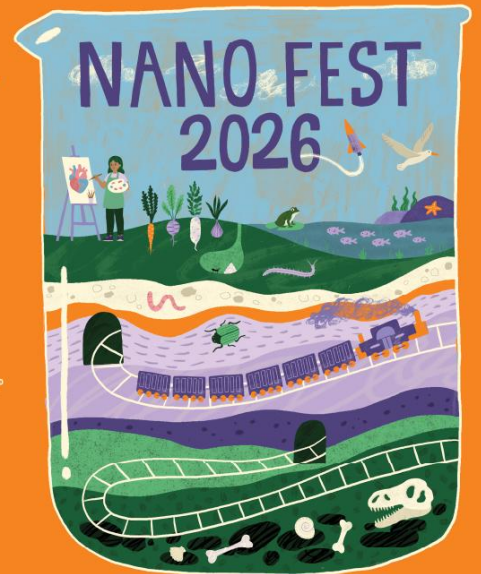
