A Clutha Heritage Update

Kia ora people of Milton and beyond,
I wanted to give an update on the Milton content now up on the Clutha Heritage website.

Thanks to Nancie Allison, we have an oral history and many fascinating photographs of Milton, Moneymore, Glenore, Manuka Gorge, and Waitahuna.

Keith Rogan, and the Tokomairiro Museum, have kindly allowed for some of their photographs to be shared, including woollen mill and pipe band images. We have a growing collection of Milton Camera Club images depicting the town in the 1960s. These provide a balance of colour to the many black and white photographs on Clutha Heritage.

I have recorded an oral history conversation with Colin Smith and Colin Heads regarding Milton during their lifetime, and the old identities they remember. Plus, I have recorded a fascinating conversation with Colin and Jennifer Smith about the history of Gray's and their time in the business. These are yet to be published but will be online shortly once editing is completed. Colin Heads has also kindly allowed his sketches of Milton buildings to be published online. I am currently working on digitising some of the woollen mill archives now held by the South Otago Heritage Society and have a few more oral histories planned.

If you haven't checked out the website yet, you may find a story you connect to, or a building which you might have memories of. Who knows, you might even find a photograph of yourself. Clutha Heritage is an opportunity to reminisce, to share, and to document the history of our places and people. Search "Clutha Heritage" online. Or, if you can't access the website at home, you can pop into the library, and we will help you.

Thank you to all those who have shared their stories, their photographs, artwork, and their time. I hope you have enjoyed the content so far! In a month's time, I will be heading to Owaka to share some stories of the Catlins. While I cannot digitise the wealth of heritage in this town, for now there is more to come.
