Matariki

Yesterday I had the pleasure of joining other members of the Milton community to celebrate Matariki. I thought all of the performances were great and I thoroughly enjoyed watching not only our Kapa Haka group but also Milton Primary, St Mary's and Tokomairiro Early Childhood Centre. During this week at school we will be celebrating Matariki with some activities at lunchtimes, students will be able to make stars out of harakeke and purehūa.

Communications

Last week we saw the first snow which meant that the buses were running late. Women's Self Defence Network - Wahine Toa

Last week a large number of our female students took part in a programme run by the Women's Self Defence Network. Unfortunately, due to the snow, one session has been postponed until this week. I spoke to a few of our students afterwards who said that they had really enjoyed the day. They learnt some self-defence techniques and also who to call and what to do in different situations.

World Vision

For over 45 years, young people of Aotearoa have stood together and shown the world what our small nation is capable of through the World Vision 40 Hour Famine. Right now, the

fall-out from the COVID-19 pandemic is pushing millions of kids in sub-Saharan Africa to the brink of starvation, and many may not survive.

Last Friday saw our orange themed multi day raise \$140 towards the \$1000 goal. Over the weekend a number of our students gave up food or sleep for 40 hours. I spoke to Alena, one of our head students, this morning who gave up food. She said that it was really challenging and made her realise how hard life is when there is no food available. She was very happy to take part in the challenge and hopes that the money we have raised will help families in sub-Saharan Africa.

Loves Me Not

We have Rochelle Gordon, from the New Zealand Police, coming to school on Wednesday 7th July. Loves Me Not is a programme facilitated by the NZ Police and will be running for all of our Year 12 students.

The Loves Me Not Programme is based on Sophie Elliot's story and focuses on healthy relationships, safe choices and looking after your friends. It is a programme that we offer to all our Year 12 students each year, as do many other schools across New Zealand. Promoting healthy relationships and how to access support is a hugely important thing for our young people. Through the Loves Me Not programme, students will be equipped with the skills to recognise and do something about unhealthy, and abusive relationships.

School Ball

Planning is well underway for the School Ball on Friday 30th July. The theme this year is very exciting, but a secret. Tickets are \$70 and students need to have their full payment, and their permission slip returned by the end of term. Also, if there are any parents willing to help out on the night can you please let the school know.
