# Milton Op Shop + is Taking Shape

Plans to establish a not-for-profit Op Shop in Milton have moved much closer to reality by establishing a new Trust. The store aims to open in about three months, and the board consists of driven Milton residents with business and/or management backgrounds.

Arna from the Milton Hub is very supportive of the new initiative, saying that 'the fact that there will be an Op shop to support our most vulnerable with affordable homeware, furniture and clothing is fantastic! We fully support this initiative." Board Secretary, Sue Maunder is "really excited" to see the plans come to life. "The feedback we have had has been positive. It has been rewarding seeing our plans slowly start to take on life. Various community groups are keen to work with us and the aim of the shop is - *By Milton, For Milton and With Milton.*" Another trustee, Luciana De Araujo who is originally from Brazil, says it is important that the Op Shop+ also functions as a welcoming place to those who are new to Milton and have come from other towns in New Zealand or from other countries.

The Board wants to make the goods in the shop affordable, and the profit every month can go to a Milton community group once the shop has been up and running. Members encourage any community group to get in touch with the Board. The idea is that the community groups can hold activities in the space next to the store or promote what services they provide. In addition, the Shop will be working with other community groups and inviting them to 74 Union Street to hold workshops/small events to promote themselves and their services.

Currently the board is seeking additional funding to cover the start-up costs, "We are humbled by the support and generosity that has been shown to us so far. Bunnings has been very generous donating building supplies and a brand new safe" Mirjam Spronk says. Offerings of clothing and furniture donations have started. The Board has requested that locals start saving their spring-cleaning items and donate them to this new initiative.

WINZ has expressed keen interest to use the Milton Op Shop+ as a retail training store and, with the new Countdown opening in Balclutha, it is an opportunity for people to gain experience, training and a qualification in retail. ## Aqua Bots Winners 2021

On the 18th of July the first Dunedin Aqua bots challenge was held. This is an underwater robot competition run by the Ministry of Inspiration. Earlier in Term 2 we received our Aqua bot kit. It was a bunch of pipes and wires. We began our building process, we built the frame, drilled holes and learnt to wire strip. We soldered wires to make a circuit for the controller, and soldered wires to the motors, we waterproofed the motors in film canisters using wax, it was a messy job.

We then spent the next few weeks trying out our Aqua bot and we discovered that we could make it move better. First

we took away some buoyancy so our Aqua bot could dive down into the water and grab stuff. We designed different hooks for different challenges and fixed the propellers. We added red tape for visibility as it was hard to see in the water. Two shiny fins were added and we called our Aqua bot *Long Fin*, inspired by the longest Long Fin eel found in Lake Waihola. Now our Aqua bot was finished and ready for competition day.

The competition was made up of three underwater challenges at Moana pool. We worked as a team to drive our Aqua bot through obstacles, turn on sensors and finally we picked up items. My favourite part was trying to pick up a shark item using a hook we had attached. Part of the competition included a quiz and we managed to get the questions right. During the competition we did a presentation about our building processes and challenges. The Aqua bots competition finished with a prize giving. Our team was so excited to hear we got first place, all our hard work had paid off. I really enjoyed this challenge and can't wait to either attend the national competition in Nelson or attend the next Dunedin event.

Thursdays at the Milton Bruce RSA are a must for


NGZ anyone wanting to try to win a raffle while discussing tactical maneouvers over a thirst quenching cold
