Welcome to Maori language week. There will be plenty of activities for students and staff to ensure we practice and engage with this official language of New Zealand.

We certainly live in interesting times; it has been 70 years since we last had a new Monarch. There is a lot of sorrow regarding the loss of the Queen and also some excitement and a bit of trepidation as to what King Charles 3rd will bring to the role.
