Helping Out in Hawkes Bay

I would like to thank the BoT, staff, and students of Tokomairiro High School for supporting me to be deployed to the Hawkes Bay as part of the Red Cross Response to Cyclone Gabrielle. I work part-time as the Guidance Counsellor at the school and outside of school I have my own private counselling practice. It was very rewarding to be able to use my skills in such a vulnerable time for others parts of the country.

I was working as a Psychosocial Support Lead during my time away and was working alongside the Operational and Disaster Welfare Support Team leaders. The focus of my role meant that I was providing mental health and wellbeing interventions to team members during and after deployment. In addition to this I also had the privilege of working closely with affected whanau in the wider Bayview and Esk Valley areas. This included travelling and supporting in the 'no go zones' as well as in the Bayview Civil Defence Centre hub.

My experiences/training have taken me to a number of national emergency events and the magnitude of this one will remain one of the largest I have been involved in. The communities affected by Cyclone Gabrielle spread across vast areas of our country and each will need the support of fellow New Zealanders to recover and regenerate what was lost.

Hopefully by having this well-timed and delivered psychosocial support individuals and communities will recover from the disaster and there will be a strengthened community that supports both the recovery and resiliency of the people. I especially enjoyed working alongside children/young people who show a miraculous capacity for resiliency in such a dire situation.

In conjunction with our prefects I hope to host a multi-day in a few weeks to contribute financially to the Red Cross appeal whose focus is on giving back to those communities in many ways. SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Kia ora,

I attended a principal's meeting last week in Dunedin, and several primary and secondary principals expressed their concern at the poor levels of behaviour they were experiencing with their new students. We unfortunately have also seen a drop in acceptable behaviour from a small minority of students.

We as a school reflect our community and I am sure that the behaviors we are seeing are being replicated within Milton and the surrounding areas.

It is disappointing that hear that some believe the school is responsible for the behaviours we are seeing, and it is just not the case. As an example:

- Do we have bullies at our school? Unfortunately like every school in New Zealand the answer is *yes we do*. However, we do not *teach* these behaviours or in any way *encourage* them. We do not accept them as part of the way we operate. We have systems and procedures in place to curb this as best we can. We did not create the problem but are trying to manage it.

- We are also not responsible for student actions in the park or through the town.

- We do not encourage students to ride their bikes through town without a helmet.

- We are not responsible for the antisocial messages students share on the social media platforms.

Much of the behaviour we see starts of outside school usually on social media and school is often the first place where students interact in person afterwards and choose our site to sort out their problems.

We do take seriously our mission statement "Working together to inspire excellence in education, in character and in life" so we will work with you to make things better. Education has been described as a tricycle with each of the wheels (teachers, students and parents) working in unison to keep us going forwards. However, when one of these wheels is not working this is when we get problems and may not make progress.

As I mentioned last year a student with 100% punctuality and attendance will only spend 11% of their year at school. We will do all we can in the 11% of time we have with students and rely on parents and students to take care of the remaining 89%

It's very easy to blame the school for the troubles we as a society are experiencing and unfair to expect us to solve them as well.

It takes a village to raise a child and we are happy to be part of this village and will gladly work with you to raise young people with skills, opportunities and values to be part of a productive society. However, we cannot do it on our own.

I would like to repeat that we are dealing with a very small minority of students and our weekly Genesis publication features countless examples of how our students and teachers are excelling in all areas of the school and we are proud of these accomplishments.

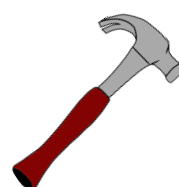
