

Forestry Pathways Report

The third term has had a strong focus on establishment with site visits and practical planting and experience.

We also had a visit to the Purakanui Falls on the 17th August. Within this bush, there is both Native Beech Forest and Native Podocarp Forest growing side by side. This gave the students an insight into these species

which are common in the South Island. (This trip was a follow-up to our visit to the Botanical Gardens tree identification visit.)

Most of the students have completed or are working towards Unit Standard 23000: "Demonstrate forestry foundation skills under supervision for plantation forest establishment."

We have also visited Gorton's Sawmill in Milton, where a student from last year's pathways course is working full time. The students showed a lot of interest in the timber (clear wood) and lower grade (knots) sections and how pruning affected this. The new kiln drying plant was also interesting to all with it being powered by burning waste from the saw mill.

On the 8th September we visited Mike Hurring Logging in Balclutha where Josh Hurring and Phil Williams gave us a breakdown of the training available for harvesting apprentices along with a tour of the facilities. This included machines and a training simulator.

Next term, there will be a focus on career pathways and employment, along with an overnight industry trip to Canterbury to visit various forestry related industries. - Alistair McKenzie (course tutor)

After six years of marriage and two sons, he trained at Knox College to become a Presbyterian Minister.
