## Junior Curriculum Review

Our next step is to gather the opinions and ideas of the students and then use all of this to create a curriculum that will fit our school and community.

## Vaping

Like many other schools around the country we are seeing a number of students bringing vaping products into school. Vaping is not allowed on school premises and we in no way condone students vaping. We will be confiscating vaping products when we find them and working hard to make our school a vape free environment. Last week both the Ministry of Education and the Police sent information to schools about vaping. It is very clear that while vaping may reduce the

health risks of smoking it is not something a non-smoker should consider starting. The long-term effects of vaping are not clear and are currently being investigated. As a school we will be developing an education programme for the students around the health risks and the legalities of vaping. If you have any concerns about vaping please contact us.

## Open Evening

On Monday 21st June we will be holding an Open Evening. This is an opportunity for prospective students and parents to look around the school and ask questions of both current staff and students. The evening will start in the school hall at 6pm.

## Year 11 Careers Expo

With over 40 exhibitors, this is a fabulous opportunity for students to explore a variety of possible career options and tertiary study providers. ## Tokomairiro Museum and Information Centre Report

An afternoon tea was held recently for Helen Griffin who has given many volunteer hours service to the Centre and Museum since opening in 1998. Helen's knowledge, dedication and personality have ensured the smooth running of the Centre. Thankyou Helen from us all and appreciation from the Milton Community too.

Visitor numbers over the last year may have reduced but there is still plenty happening despite a lack of overseas visitors. New Zealand residents have certainly been travelling about which has resulted in many seeking family history information and interested in our displays. Our Facebook page is also creating inquiries and comments. Several projects have been undertaken, three new cabinets have arrived and been assembled ready to be filled, an AN-ZAC display was set up and we held another fabulous Book Sale back in February.

Some new storage shelving has been constructed by the Blokes Shed group for which we are most grateful.

We were offered a sign off the Marguerite Mirabaud shipwreck which has duly arrived and will be displayed with other items relating to this ship.

Gerald Grant, who donated the sign, shares its history...

*On the morning of February 18th 1907 the day after the ship wrecked, my grandfather, William Grant (a ships engineer), rode along Akatore Beach on his horse to check out the wreck. He found the galley sign of the ship washed up on the beach and took it home with him. He hung the sign up in his home in Milton and later this was given to his son, Ian Grant, who was born in Milton living there until a move to Dunedin. Ian was married to Elizabeth McLean and moved to Timaru where he ran his business as a furrier. Ian, who was also an artist, painted a picture of the Marguerite Mirabaud wreck and hung this in his shop for many years receiving offers to buy the painting but never sold it. The galley sign hung in their home in Timaru for many years, passing on to me upon my father's death.*

Gerald kindly donated the sign to the Museum to be with the other memorabilia we hold. Gerald has restored the sign so quite a contrast to the one already on display.

With the cooler days here now it is a good time to visit the Museum and check out the district's history and family stories.

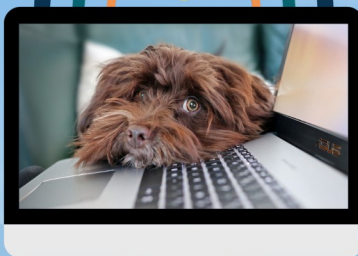
