Water Treatment Plant Action

Clutha District Council takes immediate action regarding a water quality concern at Milton Water Treatment Plant

Clutha District Council has taken immediate action to address drinking water detailed in a Compliance Order served by Taumata Arowai for the Milton drinking water supply.

Taumata Arowai served the compliance order on Friday 24 November following the regulator's review of Milton's drinking water safety plan (DWSP).

Clutha District Council Chief Executive Steve Hill said staff had been working on addressing the biggest concern expressed in the Compliance Order being the Clean in Place (CIP) recycling into the system.

Council has stopped the practice of recycling CIP waste back into the treatment process to address concerns raised by the regulator. The waste is being stored in an onsite tank for transport and disposal.

Mayor Bryan Cadogan said the Clutha District Council is committed to achieving compliance with a plan and actions moving forward.

"We are working closely with Taumata Arowai to achieve the goal of meeting the requirements of this order," Mayor Cadogan said.

The order also identified non-compliant issues regarding monitoring, recording and record keeping and necessary infrastructure upgrades.

Actions have been identified in conjunction with Taumata Arowai and a plan is in place that is being implemented. The Compliance Order requires actions to be taken by certain timeframes.

In summary, the compliance order requires the Council to:

- 1. Install appropriate monitoring infrastructure.
- Keep and maintaining accurate records of monitoring data.
- 3. Amend and implement the supply's DWSP.
- 4. Identify all necessary infrastructure upgrades, including for recycling waste streams.

The Compliance Order sets out what's needed to meet the requirements of the Water Services Act and Drinking Water Quality Assurance Rules and provide assurance to the regulator that Clutha District Council is providing a supply of safe drinking water to its community

safe drinking water to its community.
This along with other compliance work already underway would address the first deadline of 31 January 2024.

The Clutha District Council has until 31 January 2025 to ensure all directions or conditions relating to the order have been rectified.

The Rebus Club of Milton

The speaker at the November meeting, Colin Brown, is known to many members having lived in and around Milton. He and two partners devised the system known as TracMap (now Tabula) which is used worldwide for the precise application of fertiliser and sprays in agriculture and horticulture and also for aerial pest control.

It started small with a Hyslop truck, a fish finder and other tools. Over the years the team has grew to 25. Colin handed over responsibility in 2015 and moved to the USA to continue marketing with some success; Americans being slow to adopt the technology. The business today employs 60 staff with over 60,000 jobs undertaken in a busy month. The cost saving to users is 15% and the printed maps show up where inefficiencies occur that can be rectified. The system could be used for other businesses.

Colin has been supportive of cycle trails and became involved with planning for the trail development between Waihola and Mosgiel, chairing the committee. Negotiation involves many hours with landowners and regulatory bodies. The length of the trail is approximately 46 km and the cost \$10.8 million. The resulting ride will provide plenty of different sections with wetlands, farms and the Silverstream to enjoy. Colin was thanked by Lex Adam and given a gift of fruit.

Consultation on Speed Limits
The Clutha District Council is asking for submissions on proposed changes to speed limits over the whole district. intention is to improve safety, and reduce fatal and serious accidents, in line with the Government nationwide 'Road to Zero' campaign.

There are four draft Speed Management Plans, covering "Safe Speeds Around Our Schools", "In Our Urban Towns", "In Our Rural Towns", and "On Our Rural Roads".

There are 2 significant changes proposed. One is to reduce speed limits on streets near our urban schools (i.e. within about 100 metres of a school) to 30 km/hr from 50 km/hr, and reduce to 60 km/hr near schools in rural areas that currently have a higher limit. It is proposed that these will be permanent reductions, that would apply at all times. Note that the proposal is only for Council controlled roads, not any State Highways. The State Highways are controlled by NZTA/Waka Kotahi, and will be the subject of separate consultation.

The other significant proposed change is to lower the speed limit on all gravel roads in the district to 80 km/hr, where these currently have a 100 km/hr limit.

Cricket Report
The Clutha Comets cliniched their inaugural victory in the Clutha Vets South Otago Premier T20 Competition, triumphing over the Waihola Swans by 7 runs at the Royal Landfill in Kaitangata. Opting to bat after winning the toss, Clutha's opening duo, Caleb Carson and Kelan Smith, notched up a promising 42-run partnership, but quick wickets, including Carson's pivotal dismissal, left them at 62 for 3. Despite valuable contributions from the middle order, Clutha posted a challenging total of 118/9 in their twenty overs, with Carson leading the scoring at 29, and Smith contributing 21. Waihola's Ryan Clark starred with the ball, claiming four wickets for 14 runs.

Waihola's response faltered early, losing both openers at 22. Persistent pressure from Clutha's bowlers saw Waihola at 34 for 4, but a resilient 28-run partnership between Rowan Craw and Jared Cunningham offered a glimmer of hope. However, Craw's dismissal at 62 tilted the match in Clutha's favor. Levin Coulter-Butler's composed innings brought Waihola within ten runs of the target with an over remaining, but Kelan Smith's cool-headed bowling secured victory for Clutha. Coulter-Butler top-scored for Waihola with 30. Clutha's Nick Manston was instrumental in the middle overs, claiming three wickets for 19 runs.

Buoyed by this win, Clutha Comets now set their sights on the upcoming forty-over competition, while Waihola seeks inspiration for future South Otago finals. In the third vs fourth playoff, the Kaitangata Kings secured a narrow six-run victory over the Owaka Bandits.


