At Milton Kindergarten we are just about to undertake our journey through enviroschools. Through this we are looking at promoting Te Ao Māori. We are focusing on developing working theories, promoting Atua Māori, developing Te Reo Māori (that moves past directional language. We will also be looking at attitudes of playfulness, curiosity and exploration by using the notice, recognise and respond formula to enrich children's play and learning through Te Ao Māori.

School to Install Security Cameras



Tokomairiro High School aims to provide a safe and secure environment to protect staff and students by using CCTV to:

- To increase personal safety of staff, students and visitors.
- To protect Tokomairiro High School buildings and assets.
- To assist Senior Leaders investigating student and/or staff related incidents.
- To assist in managing Tokomairiro High School, particularly areas with high Health and Safety risk.

The Tokomairiro High School school board and senior management have made the decision to install 10 CCTV cameras around the school grounds. This has been a timely decision with reference to the second bullet-point as we have seen an increase in graffiti and vandalism around the school grounds particularly at night and during the weekends similar to that experienced in Milton also.

During the July school holidays the school was targeted twice with graffiti once on Saturday 16th July and then again on Tuesday 19th July with both incidents taking place after 5.30pm. These have been reported to the police along with photos. The cost of installing these cameras along with the cost of removal of the graffiti and repairing the damage caused to school property is funded through the school operational budget. This means there is less money for school resources for students as well as sporting and culture trips meaning parents will be expected to cover more of the costs. Any incidents recorded on these cameras during school hours will be dealt with through the school's disciplinary processes and procedures. Incidents recorded after school hours will continue to be referred to the police.

The staff and students of Tokomairiro High School are rightly proud of the facilities we have and are disappointed that this action is necessary.

Staff professional development continues, and we will have to close the school for Years 9-13 on 26th August so staff can continue to prepare for the next NCEA exam system coming into effect in the near future. Dates for this keep changing as trials and interruptions to education around the country occur.

Needless to say that when it is finally implemented we hope to be as ready as possible and will give our students the best possible opportunity to succeed.

DRUG DOG VISIT

As mentioned in a previous letter we will be bringing a drug dog onto the school site to ensure that our school is drug free. A date is being finalised and we will be keeping students informed as to the process. We hope to visit all classrooms in the time allocated. The dog will screen each room in accordance with the Education and Training Act 2020. The dog will be screening the rooms and its contents rather than students. The screening takes approximately 2-3 minutes and provides minimal disruption to student learning. If you have any questions about the process, please feel free to contact me at the school. In no way are we suggesting that we have a drug problem at the school, we are however choosing to be proactive in ensuring that we keep drugs out of school.

I trust all parents enjoyed the extra time they had with their children and looking forward to them returning to school to continue with a successful year. We are looking forward to their return and preparing them for the rest of the year.

The Duck Pond - by Josh Lister

It's early morning and the sun has only just risen. I stand on the back of the truck and drive into the paddock housing the duck pond, itching with excitement. My fingers and toes are frozen, but I'm so excited that it doesn't bother me. The duck pond is the heart of the farm, shaped like a long oval with trees and wetland to each side; it's a prime home for mallard ducks. The edge of the pond is surrounded in long flax bushes drooping into the dirty dark brown water that's been disturbed by ducks diving to feed on the bugs and worms. Over the lush, green, ungrazed grass on the bank is a creek so clear you can see the eels and fish swimming beneath the surface, the water is ice cold and flowing fast.

While sitting in the blind waiting for ducks, I can hear the surrounding nature full of life. I can hear the birds chirping and the magpies singing. I can hear the breeze blowing on the surrounding willow trees and see the leaves fluttering onto the surface of the duck pond, leaving nothing but a ripple. I hear the surrounding neighbours lucking out on ducks as their shots ring through the valley. The tensions are high as we sit and wait for a sign of ducks. We sit together sharing stories of past years and having a laugh. While doing so our eyes are peeled to the sky, looking for a sign of ducks.

With some luck, we see a small group of mallard ducks looking for a place to stay. I feel the rush of excitement and start blowing into the duck caller in an effort to entice the group into the pond. Suddenly, I hear the whooshing and beating of the wings as the group of mallards buzz the duck blind. They swing over the trees and set themselves up for landing; they cup their wings and throw their feet out like landing gear on a plane. I look over at the other people in the blind with a smile a mile wide on my face to see all the others doing the same. "Get into them!" Dad says, and we raise our guns and start shooting. One duck in particular is in my sights; it's the closest to me and it's a beautiful looking mallard drake. It has a distinctive white ring around its neck and a head as green as grass. I click the safety off the shotgun. The ducks are flying fast so I aim just in front of it and squeeze the trigger, BANG! The duck folds and it's dead before it hits the water.

I can smell the dirty gunpowder that burns the inside of my nostrils; and hear the dog whining to be released into the pond to fetch the duck. She's a six year old purebred black lab who's full of adrenaline. The second the lead is unclipped she rushes out with her nose in the air and eyes to the pond scanning for the dead ducks. She spots the drake mallard I shot and she rushes after it. Without a care in the world, she leaps into the icy cold pond and gets a grip on the duck and turns back to blind with it in her mouth; she weaves in and out in an attempt to avoid hitting the decoys and clambers up the muddy slippery bank into the blind presenting me with my harvest. I briefly scan the duck and only then begin to realise what a good looking bird it is. It has a bright yellow beak, a beautiful green head and a dark brown chest shading into a grey underbelly; the wings have a large patch of dark purple and it has three curls on its tail. The others look on in awe at the sight of the duck I've just shot.

The duck pond is an amazing place full of life and unforgettable memories. I could sit in the blind at the duck pond for hours upon hours and not feel a second of boredom. No matter how many or how little ducks you shoot, there's no doubt you will leave with an accomplished feeling and a burning passion to get out again soon.

Toko Gym Report

This will be my last Genesis Report as Gym Manager and it's been very rewarding working at our Gym. I have especially enjoyed seeing the benefits that come from having a community gym in a small town and seeing people from school students, through to the older generation all using it,



along with physio patients using it to regain strength following accidents, surgery. There are many more reasons that gym work can help our health and wellbeing.

A big welcome to Rebecca Shaw who is the new Gym Manager and is really looking forward to her new role. Be sure to say hello and introduce yourself to Rebecca when you're at the gym.

Last week the gym had a lights upgrade done with all new LED lights being installed. This is a big improvement and also the LED lights are more energy efficient – saving money in the long term. The following information outlines the benefits:

1. LED lights are highly energy efficient and consume much less power than incandescent bulbs and halogen lamps. Up to 90% of energy used is converted into visible light. ...
2. Unlike incandescent bulbs and halogen lamps which take too much time to build up to full brightness, LED lights glow at full brightness as soon as they are switched on.
3. LED lights have a really long life span. At room temperature, LED lights can run up to 50,000 hours. ...

We were very lucky to obtain support for this improvement through a successful grant application to TTCF and very much appreciate their support. Our members are very happy with the upgrade.
