## **Toko Training - Forestry Pathways Course**

We have had eleven students on the Course for the first term. All students completed drug tests in the first two weeks (all negative).

Over the last three months we have completed four unit standards:

17769 - D.K.O General Health, safety and environmental requirements in forestry

22994 - D.K.O Factors that affect the performance of forestry workers

6916 - D.K.O The rules relating to chainsaw use.

6917 - Demonstrate Basic Chainsaw use.

We have visited Wenita, City Forests, and Earnslaw One, the forestry companies from The Southern Wood Council who support our course.


The chainsaw use component of the course was carried out cross cutting logs donated by Wenita into firewood rings over four days. All the student's confidence and practical skills improved immensely during this time. We also felled a large blue gum tree at the Taieri Lakes Golf Club and cleared the branches as well as ringing up the stem.

In April we began pruning in a first lift operational which will continue in the second term. Tree selection and pruning quality has been the main focus on the first few days. Improving the students physical skills and output will follow.

The Youth Future Foresters Day in Winton on the 18th March was excellent and the students all got value from the visit.

Next term we will concentrating on pruning and planting when it begins in late May or early June. There will be visits to a nursery and processing plants at various stages during the term.







We have had such a great first term at Tokoiti! We have welcomed our new teacher, Tammy, to our junior class. If you are looking for a school for your new entrant be sure to come up and meet her!

The term was full of a variety of sports. We had visits from Casey our Sports Activator, we enjoyed athletics day at Milton Primary, had swimming lessons and the Year 3-6's attended a Football Tournament. Five of our Trekkers went to the South Otago Athletics to represent the Milton schools and from there Marshall qualified to represent South Otago at the Southland Champs, well done!

We had children's writer/performer Kath Bee visit us as our Duffy Role Model. She read one of her books, sang for us and presented all of our Trekkers with their two Duffy books. We also attended the visiting Duffy Theatre "Bubble Trouble". We love being a Duffy School, thank you to Westpac Balclutha for sponsoring us!

World Vision Leadership conference with Mr Gilling. The students were made aware of a huge upcoming humanitarian disaster, with a lack of food causing a famine in subsaharan Africa.

It is estimated that 800 million people will be affected. Morganne-Lee and Alena will be running the 40 hour famine at school to help raise money for this huge problem. The 40 hour famine will take place on 27th June.

Family Learning Conferences

**Vaping** On 11 November 2020, changes took effect under the Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products Act that saw the existing prohibition on smoking at schools, kura, early learning services and kōhanga reo extended to include vaping. We are currently updating all of the signage to reflect the changes. This means that our school must be smoke free and vape free, both indoors and outdoors, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.



## **Careers Trip to Cromwell**

On Wednesday the 5th May, Tokomairiro High School combined with South Otago High School and took students from Years 12 and 13 on a careers trip to Cromwell. The purpose of this field trip was to open students minds to the opportunities that exist in the Central Otago area. Hopefully this will inspire some wider thinking about future careers, and the realisation that there are amazing choices on their doorstep.

This was a fully funded trip as the ministry opened a contestable fund 18 months ago and the two careers teachers put in a joint application. This was to further careers information and extend student knowledge about training and options in the wider Otago region.

Two places of interest were visited:

#### Otago Polytechnic, Cromwell Campus

The whole group visited parts of this campus. All students gained more knowledge about the courses on offer and hopefully this will spark interest in future continued education at tertiary level and lead to career choices.

The areas covered were;

Brewing – both beer and wines

Building – this years' students are building a new admin

block

Automotive

Horticulture – saw the new huge green house and potting

Parks and gardens – a practical demonstration Stonemasonry – practical skills shown and tried Visit to the orchard and vineyard Apiculture

High country farming

This was a highly informative session and students were actively engaged.

**Highlands Motorsport Park** 

Students from both schools were excited to go the motorsport park. The range of careers was much larger than the students had envisaged. They were informed and saw in action, careers in; hospitality motor mechanics, tourism and event management.

Two major highlights from this part of the day were; as we had a careers talk, we were driven around the main race track in our bus. Then we all had a turn in groups driving a go-cart. Some of us weren't very fast in our go-cart, it was however, just as exciting.

The field trip has proven to be valuable as several students have already asked for more in-depth information about courses and accommodation options.

## **Blue Light Flight**

On Sunday the 18th of April I went to Balclutha Aerodrome, along with several other high school students from around the district, as part of a Blue Light event organised by the Police.

We arrived at 9:30 for a briefing and to find out who we'd be flying with. There were nine other aircraft assembled so we waited for our turn to take off. Once we left the ground we made our climb out, headed to the Taieri Aerodrome. We flew past my house in Tokoiti,

following state highway one then made radio contact with the Dunedin air traffic control tower and five minutes later we landed at Taieri (where the Rescue Helicopter Base is).

We toured the rescue helicopter base for about an hour. They have six helicopters (four rescue, one agricultural spray and one in reserve.) We had some refreshments and a group photo taken to remember the day by. On the way back we flew along the coast down past Brighton and Taieri Mouth over the ocean. Also on the way back Murray Bichan let me take control of the plane for a few minutes which was the highlight of my trip. We turned back in at Kai and flew in a large circle before coming into Clutha to land. We were the last plane in.


