Long Serving Teachers to Retire



David Gilling joined the staff at Tokomairiro High School as a beginning teacher at the start of 1989. David, his wife Jocelyn and their young son Nathan moved from Christchurch to Milton to begin his teaching career. Jocelyn and David made Milton their home, living in the school house on Keinan Ave.

David's passion for working with young people, and for the outdoors, soon had him heavily involved in the camps, kayaking and rock climbing trips. He then extended the outdoor education programme

and that involved numerous tramping trips. Two particular highlights were taking students into the remote Rockburn Valley and tenting in the snow, and kayaking down the Pomahaka river with a group of senior students. David led Outdoor Education in the school for twenty years - an outstanding effort!.

David and Jocelyn's family extended to four children over the next few years. As the children grew and went through Tokomairiro High School, David was very involved with the PTA, being chairperson for a number of years. It was under his watch that the Lake to Sea Trail Ride fundraiser began. Science has been David's specialist curriculum area over his years at Tokomairiro High School with a particular interest in Biology; he was the teacher in charge of biology from early in his career. Many students for many years have fond

As a Dean, David was supportive, firm and fair. He took on this role in 1997 and worked with both junior and senior students, supporting them on their journey through school.

David took on the role of HOD Science in 2014 and led the science department for the next couple of years, before the opportunity arose for him to move into senior leadership when one of the Deputy Principals went on leave in 2016.

Milton has been a big part of the life of David, Jocelyn and children, all of whom are now married with children. They loved living here, enjoying a small semi-rural town.

Following Jocelyn's illness and passing in 2019, David is now moving to Christchurch to work with his son, following his other passion - working with wood.

We thank David for his outstanding contribution to Tokomairiro High School and the wider community and wish him all the very best for the years ahead.

Genesis Christmas Holiday Dates

This year Tokomairiro High School farewells one of its longest serving teachers, Allison Butler. This was Allison's seventh school to teach in and she arrived here in 1985. Of note, is her continuous service with only a couple of short breaks for extended holidays.

Originally trained for primary school teaching, Allison went on to further her studies shortly after an initial stint at Wairoa Intermediate. From there, she ended up in secondary



teaching. At Tokomairiro, she was first employed as an English teacher, but it wasn't long before she took on the HOD Social Studies role. During her time here, as well as these two subjects, she has taught classics and history and even dabbled in media studies. She also recalls taking girls for physical education when she first arrived; and a softball team. Other roles have included deaning at all levels and being a relieving Guidance Counsellor. In her early years she also taught Māori at lunchtimes and after school.

Asked what her standout positive memories are, she mentions the joy of students succeeding, and overcoming challenges, and then going on to do amazing things after leaving school. Another highlight was her trip to the Northland Ruapekapeka pa site in 2007, when Lindsay Laing was Principal. She found it incredible to be able to connect with the history associated with the place, and was grateful for the opportunity.

Asked what she will do in retirement, she says, "Breathe. Sleep in. Paint the house. Have a life." When ready, she can imagine helping out in schools with reading; being involved in

some sort of grandparenting programmes.

As a colleague, Allison will definitely be missed for her acerbic wit, and insightful intelligence.

Allison, we wish you well in your retirement, and give you thanks for all the years you have put into your teaching.


