Outdoor Education with Branch Dwellers

Recently our Year 12/13 Outdoor Education class has been lucky enough to take part in some organised tree climbing with Branch Dwellers. This is linked to our Level 2 Risk Management standard.

The teachers from Branch Dwellers set up two activities for the students. One was tree climbing and one was a rope swing. Both activities involved analysis around the safety management strategies of these activities and how risks can be managed in this environment. We were very fortunate to have great instructors and our Year 11's will be joining in this coming Friday.

'I AM HOPE' Presentation Shares Skills

Last week the school was very privileged to attend a presentation by Tai Tupou from the I AM HOPE campaign. He and his colleagues travel around to NZ schools to discuss mental health with an aim to reduce and normalise conversations about mental health.

Tai used his own personal story as a pathway to engage the students around the challenges he faced in addressing his mental health and what worked and didn't work on his journey. He was "matter of fact" in his approach and often highlighted and normalised the feelings that we all have at certain times that make us feel isolated. Ionely and sad. This included normalising the "inner critic" that we all have. He spoke about not talking to others about what was going on for him, the expectations that he had of himself and the loneliness and sadness that overwhelmed him at the time and prevented him from getting help because he feared the judgement of others. This was a valuable insight because he was able to highlight why people become so desperate and sad in life without others noticing and why people cannot continue the path they are on.

Tai spoke of the support of a friend reaching out to him as the starting point to getting the help he needed. He was a vital lifeline in supporting him to go on to get professional support.

While in counselling he spoke of learning new skills to conquer the challenges in his life and most importantly became proactive in his self-care, believing in himself and subsequently supporting others.

The students were provided with I AM HOPE wristbands as a gift and he explained the purpose and responsibility to those who took them at the end.

He said "Teens know that anyone wearing one of the bands will listen and help that person without judging them, without running off and telling others." He also highlighted that "they don't have to fix the person but help them to get professional help!

The I AM HOPE trust are advocates and fundraisers who use all the funds generated to assist young people to access a counsellor and not have to wait on a waiting list for services when they are ready to talk. He provided the details and encouragement for anyone to use the service or refer others in need on to it. Written information was also provided on signs of depression, starting the conversation and some self-care strategies.

Kia ora,


We are nearly at the end of my first term as Principal and I knew it would be a tough time coming to grips with a new school and different systems, a new town and students and staff I did not know at all.

I arrived at school before the beginning of the term and attempted to settle in. However, a few days later the traffic light system was introduced and what was supposed to be a difficult but expected start in a new school became immensely more difficult. I was fortunate enough to have inherit a school that was in a good place with an incredibly supportive and experienced staff who were willing to put in the hard work preparing for the possibility of Covid entering our school. The hard work at this time really paid off and we have been very fortunate to have got off so lightly so far.

The biggest surprise was the number of emails that arrive on a daily basis. I have had nearly 3000 emails to deal with on a daily basis, all this on top of the daily job of trying to run a school. It was pretty obvious early on that it would be easy to become overwhelmed by all of this, but fortunately, I have taken steps to deal with it.

However, our students are under equal amount of pressure that they are not as well equipped to deal with.

So what can we do about this?

The school is looking very closely at well-being and started a programme to deal with this. The first steps were experienced last week with a "I am Hope" presentation around mental health. Some students will have come home wearing an "I am hope" wristband last week. There is also a very useful video that parents and caregivers can watch that will help with these pressure at home. I certainly recommend you give it a look and take some of the advice on board when dealing with the pressure and behaviours that you see.

Clutha Community Hub Funding



Council is seeking feedback on options for additional funding for Balclutha's Clutha Community Hub.

This will help inform budgets for the 2022/23 Annual Plan. Up to a further \$2.5M Council funding has been identified as our share to support the completion of this cornerstone community-led project. This would increase our overall contribution from \$7.5M to \$10M.

The options identified are:

• Do not provide up to an additional \$2.5M (a no additional rates impact option)

• Provide up to an additional \$2.5M, paid via rates (a rates impact option from 2023/24). This option would primarily affect ratepayers in the Lower Clutha community facilities rating area, but also all ratepayers via the Uniform Annual General Charge

• Provide up to an additional \$2.5M from Council's reserve funds (a no additional rates impact option). This is Council's preferred option.


