Milton Kindergarten

At Milton Kindergarten we are all about learning new strategies to support our tamariki to regulate themselves and their emotions. We have been very fortunate to be working with David, who is an occupational therapist, from the Alert Programme to teach us new things about how tamariki engines run and what we can do to support them to learn this about themselves. The Alert Programme assists tamariki in understanding the basic theory of sensory integration related to arousal states. The primary focus is to help children monitor, maintain, and change their level of alertness so that it is appropriate to a situation or task. David has brought in things that we have been able to explore with our tamariki and to test what it is they enjoy. Some of the things we have explored is the type of pressure we enjoy. We had a go at having weighted toys put on us to see if it was a sensation that we liked. We tried one over our legs and also around our neck. We have also explored being wrapped up then having some weight added on top or using a spiky ball and having that rolled over us. We could see what was enjoyed by our tamariki and what wasn't as enjoyable. We also had a discussion around whether we liked it or not and our tamariki were very verbal in these discussions sharing with us. We have loved learning all these new things with David and always really enjoy his visits and what he has to offer next.

Last Thursday night the Otago Hockey Association held its first-ever hockey awards night to celebrate and show recognition to all Secondary, Club and Representative teams.

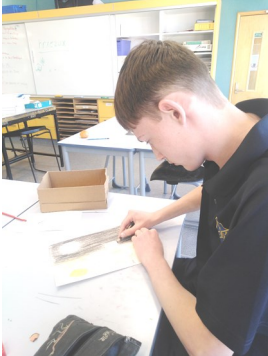
Nicholas Healey (Year 10) was awarded Most Improved player of the year for the U15's Otago Gold boys team.

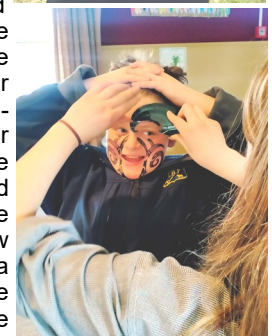
Celebrating Te Reo Māori in our kura

Last term was busy for the Māori department. We had Te Wiki o te Reo Māori activities for the entire week and hosted the senior Te Reo Māori class from Taieri College.

Te Wiki o te Reo Māori was fun-filled with activities like Tākaro, Poi rākau, Kahoot, blooket, art competition, and even a movie screening of The Whale Rider. This was all student-led, and they did a fantastic job organising everything.

In term one, our senior Te Reo Māori class visited Taieri College, so it was our turn to host them. We started with a mihi whakatau in the whare followed by a kai in the hall. We introduced ourselves by reciting our pepehā, which is always nerve-racking. After that, we had four workshops - Poi rākau, harakeke putiputi (flax flower), Pukana, and Tākaro. Each student got to rotate around the groups and learn a new game or craft. Once everyone had a turn at each rotation we took the Taieri students for a tour around the school. We headed out to the turf to play a game of Horo hōpu (similar to netball but using a large poi.) Taieri won, so we can't wait to challenge them next year. We then went back to the hall to say our last farewells and sing our school waiata to each other. We look forward to continuing our visits with Taieri College next year.

Check for pipes before you dig

If you are planning to dig on your property or on the roadside you need to check with us before you begin your project.

Digging without knowing the approximate location of underground utilities can result in damage which can lead to service disruptions - not just to you but also your neighbours.

Most pipes are usually quite deep but there is always a chance they can be dug up if their location is not verified first.

How do I check for pipes on my rural property?

You can check whether any underground pipes may be in the area you're planning to excavate by using our online mapping tool or give us a call.

There is no charge for this advice, which can often be given over the phone.

Pipes will not always be in the exact location as indicated by our mapping tool, but it is a good guide.

The land owner/occupier will be charged for damage to council pipes, unless caused in the course of normal farming operations which includes cultivation with farm equipment, but not digger work.

Please remember to report a water leak or burst pipe.

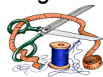
