




# **Tokomairiro High School Newsletter...**

SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Kia ora,

We have an interesting week to report on and another one teachers have to stay ahead of the curve to keep students coming up.

Last Thursday we held our first parent interviews of the year where parents, students and staff set academic goals for the year based on students' biweekly effort summaries and perceptions of how well they are doing. It was great to see so many attend and make these important decisions. Goals are important as they are a means of checking regular progress towards the school mission statement: "Working together to inspire excellence in education character and in life." If we don't set goals, how will we know if we have achieved them or not? We will be revisiting these goals later in the year to find out just that.

On Thursday the 16th both teachers' unions are holding a one day strike to support their claim for better recognition for the extra hours they do during a normal school week and also in holidays.

Those with limited knowledge of this situation have made comments which have been addressed by others but I will summarise here.

- Do teachers teach the same thing each year? This is a yes and no answer. The content of the lesson may be the same or similar but the way we teach is so very different. Gone are the days when students would sit in rows and take notes. There are far more appealing ways we can engage students, and

engaged. Research has shown that students have a much shorter concentration span. Therefore, there is a constant need to keep these students focused on their work. A study of 4-year old's has shown that watching Spongebob Squarepants with its constant changes of view reduces students concentration spans. I suggest looking at the Hunger games where each clip last approximately four seconds and then move on to The Bourne Identity where a four second clip or longer is a rarity. Our brains are being rewired to need constant stimulus and teachers need to have a variety of activities that engage students with shorter concentration spans. So, no teachers dd not teach the same lesson that they did last year or the year before but have had to adapt and it to make it more engaging. They will then review the lesson and make changes for the next time they teach this topic. This is a constant cycle of improvement.

Therefore school will be closed for instruction on Thursday 16th for all students.

# **Learning About Sustainability**



Milton Kindergarten are currently involved in the Future Focused Learning project which is bringing . kindergarten, primary schools and high schools together 'to increase the amount of future focused happening learning classrooms. To ensure that children are collaborating, innovating, problem solving and connecting around real life projects and problems happening in communities.'

For Milton kindergarten the focus has been on sustainability which aligns this project with our enviroschools journey. This

includes initiatives such as the introduction of a worm farm as well as sustainability for language and culture as we grow our ability to weave Mātauranga Māori into this journey and indeed into all that we do.

Milton kindergarten contributed work to the exhibition at Balclutha Library at the end of last year, this work is currently on display in the kindergarten, and will be displayed at Milton Library and the new hub in Balclutha over the next few months.

Supporting our youngest members of the community requires teachers to promote learning in ways that builds on their current interests and strengths. We work with a hands-on age group and so children have been engaging in the vege garden and the worm farm to develop ideas about sustainability. Children have also developed their abilities to represent their ideas through their art work developing skills with technology and paper engineering. Children of kindergarten age are developing and refining their working theories about their world. Learning in the early years provides the foundation for all later learning, so it makes sense to start the journey of suitability learning, now. The Future Focussed project provides more opportunities for us to work across our communities, as well as upskilling teachers ability to support this learning across the curriculum domains.

### NGA WHANAU O TOKOMAIRIRO INC

He aha te mea nui o tea ao? He tangata, he tangata, he tangata. What is the most important thing in the world? It is the people, it is the people, it is the people.

From a Hui held in late 2002 at the Milton Country Club, facilitated by the Department of Internal Affairs a group of Tokomairiro residents with common goals established Nga Whānau o Tokomairiro Inc in early 2003. We came together to support the needs of Māori families within the Tokomairiro District by supporting the development of whānau and community related projects. Our objectives over the next 20 years remained to facilitate the learning of Te Reo Māori, Tikanga and Māoritanga (language, customs and culture) for our community. We aimed to work with other groups for the good of the community.

After a couple of years an opportunity arose and Nga Whānau worked in partnership with Kai Tahu ki Otago to get Tokomairiro Waiora Inc established in Milton and we still continue to provide governance assistance today by having two Nga Whānau members on the Waiora Board.

The education of our tamariki and rangatahi is very important to our whānau so when an ex-Principal of Tokomairiro High School, Lindsay Laing and his wife Jan donated the prestigious Whakatutukipono Award (mere for tāne and korowai for wahine) for recognition of Māori achievement we assisted. As the recipients cannot take the mere and korowai off the school premises Nga Whānau o Tokomairiro Inc donated pounamu pendants in the beginning and then eventually trophies. For many years we supported this prestigious High School award by presenting the award to the recipients at the annual prize giving. We had two student representatives on our committee to ensure we heard the voice of our young people, as we value their thoughts and opinions, also it helped by providing them with an understanding of what being part of a committee entailed.

Funding projects isn't an easy task however for many years we successfully obtained grants from COGS (the Community Organisation Grant Scheme) and in 2018 received a donation from Cutlers Ltd. Fundraising though was our primary source of income and the funds we raised were put back in to our community — we hosted 18 community Matariki Celebrations where tamariki and rangatahi from local schools and early childhood organisations either performed kapa haka or displayed their artwork. Some years we had guest speakers or performers and there was always shared kai at the end of the celebrations. We all have wonderful memories of those days. Thank you to our community for your participation and enthusiasm at our Matariki Celebrations.

There were other events we also hosted, while not on such a large scale as Matariki they were however enjoyed by those in our community that participated - After School Sports Programme, Biggest Loser Competition, Gravity Project, Hāngi Workshop, Netball (tamariki & pakeke), Kapa Haka & Waiata Classes, Take A Kid Hunting Competition, Te Reo Maori Classes, Te Tiriti o Waitangi Workshop, Tuna (Eel) Competition, Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori events and Whānau Days which were usually held at the swimming pool and Taylor Park. It turns out Nga Whanau hosted it's final Matariki Celebration at the Coronation Hall in 2021 (although at the time we didn't know it would be our last).

As with all good things eventually there is an ending and for Nga Whanau o Tokomairiro Inc as a group the time has come. When we think back to the original hui (meeting) held back in 2002 many people envisaged a whare for the community, a warm place to come together for various hui and now we have that with Te Whare Puawai o Tokomairaro. 
