There will also be an Orange themed Mufti Day on Friday 2nd July and all proceeds will be donated to 40 Hour Famine.

Tickets are \$70, students need to have their full payment and their permission slip returned by the end of term. Also, if there are any parents willing to help out on the night, can you please let the school know.


