Milton Primary Enjoys Duffy School Performers

Milton Primary is very proud to be a Duffy School. This is a national programme, supported by our school. It helps to inspire a love of books, provides students with free books to have in their homes, and enhances the desire for our students to want to read.

Being a Duffy School means each student receives up to six free books during the year, our school library receives exciting new books, and a visiting theatre show performs. Our vision at Milton Primary is for students to be competent and confident literacy learners who have a love for reading and being a Duffy School is one way to support this.



Last week we were excited to host a group of Duffy's travelling actors bringing the message "It's Cool to Read and Cool to Achieve". This exciting show is a highlight of our school calendar and is always an entertaining experience. This year the story was set in lock-down due to Covid-19. Duffy's parents were essential workers and we watched Duffy tackle online learning, hand sanitising and were enthralled by his adventures that reminded him, and us, why reading is so important.



Milton St John Community Initiative

Recently, the Milton St John Area Committee provided over 100+ free child Car Seat Identification Stickers to some of the local early childhood centres. As part of our Community Initiative plan, the area committee identified that there was interest for these ID stickers in the community.

During the 2018-2019 financial year, St John attended 449 car crashes involving children aged under eight years old nationwide. As children are unlikely to have other forms of ID in the car, the stickers are designed to be an identifier in a motor vehicle crash if a child is left without an adult who knows them at the scene of the crash. The sticker is placed on the side of a car seat and has space for parents or caregivers to write the child's name and date of birth. There is also space on the sticker for two emergency contacts, such as next of kin, which will allow support to be accessed faster.

Tena koutou katoa,

Greetings to you all. After this week, there are only three weeks of school left this term, two of those being shortened weeks due to Easter. Students are encouraged to make the most of these three weeks of classes, especially our senior students who should now be gaining credits towards their qualifications.

There has been a lot happening over the past few weeks.

Kepler Tramp

Last week we had a group of ten Year 11 - 13 students, led by Mr Yilma and parent, Lynne Johnston, tramp the Kepler Track in Fiordland.

They had a great trip. Unfortunately, the second day, which is the day with all the spectacular views, was wet and they missed out on some amazing sights.

The group had a great tramp overall and got to explore some of the most amazing parts of our country. Thank you to Mr Yilma for his organisation and time.

Guide Dog Appeal

On Friday, a group of our students were out helping to collect for the guide dog appeal at the Four Square. This was organised by the Milton Lions Club. Thanks to all who helped

out - great community service.

Blue Light Take A Kid Flying - Sunday 18th April 2021

In conjunction with the South Otago Aero Club, we have the opportunity for 2 or 3 students to go flying on Sunday 18 April. This is open to any Year 7 - 13 students. Interested students should collect a parent/caregiver consent form from the school office and return it before Tuesday 13 April. If you are interested, make sure you complete the form - sometimes we get offered extra seats! Forms available at the school office.

Principal's Visit to Auckland Schools

On Thursday and Friday I had the opportunity to join about 18 other Principals, DPs and IT Managers on a tour of five different secondary schools in Auckland. We were looking, in particular, at their eLearning within their schools. Of all the

schools we visited, and the schools represented by the group, Tokomairiro High School was the only school which provide each student with an eLearning device. Most of the schools required the whanau to provide students with a device, some even prescribing which device was to be purchased. I saw some great eLearning activities, and learning management routines, as I do in our own school. In all cases students were required to bring their device fully charged ready for their learning each day, just as we do. I felt satisfied that Tokomairiro High school was in as good a position as any of the schools I visited and was proud at how far our school has moved with eLearning in the past few years. I recognise there is still more to develop, especially in supporting our students to develop independent learning skills - it is a continuing journey.

Principal's Sabbatical

Next week will be my last week at school until Term 3, as I am heading to Brisbane on 12th April (although Brisbane went into 3 days lockdown on Monday). I am on sabbatical for all of Term 2 and will be visiting schools in Australia and New Zealand over that time, looking specifically at programmes to support learners, especially in the senior school, to develop the capabilities to help them be successful, both across curriculum areas and in life beyond school. Currently, I will have two weeks quarantine when I return to New Zealand late May (although I am hoping the Australia New Zealand bubble may be open by then). If not, it will be a great opportunity for me to do some more reading and research, and prepare a report.

Mrs Wish will be the Acting Principal in my absence and will be supported by Tom Sinclair as Deputy Principal and David Gilling as Assistant Principal. Please remember that our Deans of Carol Bungard (Y7/8), Gemma Cowie (Malcolm / Reid) and Daryll Reddington (Ayson/Ross) are always available - by email or a phone message.

Lunches in Schools

We are starting the Ministry Healthy Lunches in Schools programme, Ka Ora Ka Ako, at the beginning of Term 2. Our providers will be Kelly's Kitchen, Milton Subway and Kaan's Catering. Dietary requirements can generally be catered for. All students in the Milton schools will receive a free lunch every day. Note that our school canteen will still be open for morning tea or students can bring along food from home. More information coming soon.

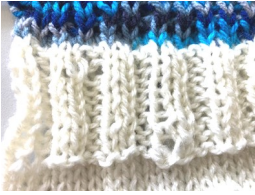

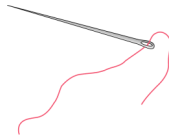

Year 9/10 Soft Materials

There is a hive of activity happening in P Block as the Year 9/10 Soft Materials class explores the techniques, processes and procedures needed to create individual products from soft materials. Students decide what they want to make then use problem solving skills to investigate suitable materials, quantities, costs, time and what skills they will need to learn. To date, the students have been exploring and developing a range of skills related to the fields of Hand and Machine Sewing, Knitting, Cross stitch and Crochet, in preparation for their final product. This will be made in Term 2. At times this "hands-on" craftsmanship has proven to be difficult yet entertaining, and I am so proud of the progress, resilience and engagement these students have demonstrated.

Everyone Welcome at Death Café

What is a Death Café?

It sounds a bit grim, maybe a bit morbid, but Death Café is none of those things. At Death Café people of all ages and stages in life gather and talk about all things to do with dying, death, mortality and, of course, life. Some people come along when we have a guest speaker, others come along every time to join in the conversation. It is totally your choice.

Death Café is hosted by The Clutha Budget Advisory Service, and came about after we saw a number of people seeking help from our service after losing loved ones. We noticed that many people were unprepared for all the administrative tasks that came with the death including not knowing what their loved one's wishes were, trying to pay for a funeral they could not afford, not having a Will, trying to figure out how to administer a small Estate.... all while dealing with grief and loss.

The first South Otago Death Café was held in Milton in mid 2019, quickly followed by Death Café's in Balclutha. This year we are alternating Balclutha and Milton so a Death Café is held in each town bi-monthly. Some of the topics we have discussed in the past include DIY and family led funerals, Wills, Powers of Attorney, small Estates, funeral / farewell options, Advance Care Planning, getting your affairs in order, making a "When I Die" file, the complexity of grief and creating a Bucket List. The list of topics for discussion is endless, unlike the time we have here on earth.

Everyone is welcome at Death Café. All you need to bring is yourself, an open mind, and a sense of humour. We will bring the coffee and cake. The first Death Café for 2021 in Milton is on Tuesday 27 April, 7pm at the Toko Hub.
