# Milton St John Community Initiative

Recently, the Milton St John Area Committee provided over 100+ free child Car Seat Identification Stickers to some of the local early childhood centres. As part of our Community Initiative plan, the area committee identified that there was interest for these ID stickers in the community.

During the 2018-2019 financial year, St John attended 449 car crashes involving children aged under eight years old nationwide. As children are unlikely to have other forms of ID in the car, the stickers are designed to be an identifier in a motor vehicle crash if a child is left without an adult who knows them at the scene of the crash. The sticker is placed on the side of a car seat and has space for parents or caregivers to write the child's name and date of birth. There is also space on the sticker



for two emergency contacts, such as next of kin, which will allow support to be accessed faster.



## Schools

On Thursday and Friday I had Nga mihi the opportunity to join about 18 Glenis Sim other Principals, DPs and IT Managers on a tour of five different secondary schools in Auckland. We were looking, in particular, at their eLearning within their schools. Of all the

schools we visited, and the schools represented by the group, Tokomairiro High School was the only school which provide each student with an eLearning device. Most of the schools required the whanau to provide students with a device, some even prescribing which device was to be purchased. I saw some great eLearning activities, and learning management routines, as I do in our own school. In all cases students were required to bring their device fully charged ready for their learning each day, just as we do. I felt satisfied that Tokomairiro High school was in as good a position as any of the schools I visited and was proud at how far our school has moved with eLearning in the past few years. I recognise there is still more to develop, especially in supporting our students to develop independent learning skills - it is a continuing journey.

#### Principal's Sabbatical

Next week will be my last week at school until Term 3, as I am heading to Brisbane on 12th April (although Brisbane went into 3 days lockdown on Monday). I am on sabbatical for all of Term 2 and will be visiting schools in Australia and New Zealand over that time, looking specifically at programmes to support learners, especially in the senior school, to develop the capabilities to help them be successful, both across curriculum areas and in life beyond school. Currently, I will have two weeks quarantine when I return to New Zealand late May (although I am hoping the Australia New Zealand bubble may be open by then). If not, it will be a great opportunity for me to do some more reading and research, and prepare a report.

Mrs Wish will be the Acting Principal in my absence and will be supported by Tom Sinclair as Deputy Principal and David Gilling as Assistant Principal. Please remember that our Deans of Carol Bungard (Y7/8), Gemma Cowie (Malcolm / Reid) and Daryll Reddington (Ayson/Ross) are always available - by email or a phone message.

#### Lunches in Schools

We are starting the Ministry Healthy Lunches in Schools programme, Ka Ora Ka Ako, at the beginning of Term 2. Our providers will be Kelly's Kitchen, Milton Subway and Kaan's Catering. Dietary requirements can generally be catered for. All students in the Milton schools will receive a free lunch every day. ## Everyone Welcome at Death Café

What is a Death Café?

It sounds a bit grim, maybe a bit morbid, but Death Café is none of those things. At Death Café people of all ages and stages in life gather and talk about all things to do with dying, death, mortality and, of course, life. Some people come along when we have a guest speaker, others come along every time to join in the conversation. It is totally your choice.

Death Café is hosted by The Clutha Budget Advisory Service, and came about after we saw a number of people seeking help from our service after losing loved ones. We noticed that many people were unprepared for all the administrative tasks that came with the death including not knowing what their loved one's wishes were, trying to pay for a funeral they could not afford, not having a Will, trying to figure out how to administer a small Estate.... all while dealing with grief and loss.

The first South Otago Death Café was held in Milton in mid 2019, quickly followed by Death Café's in Balclutha. This year we are alternating Balclutha and Milton so a Death Café is held in each town bi-monthly. Some of the topics we have discussed in the past include DIY and family led funerals, Wills, Powers of Attorney, small Estates, funeral / farewell options, Advance Care Planning, getting your affairs in order, making a "When I Die" file, the complexity of grief and creating a Bucket List. The list of topics for discussion is endless, unlike the time we have here on earth.

Everyone is welcome at Death Café. All you need to bring is yourself, an open mind, and a sense of humour. We will bring the coffee and cake. The first Death Café for 2021 in Milton is on Tuesday 27 April, 7pm at the Toko Hub.


