Is the cost of construction daunting? Yes. Is there a hefty amount of work ahead of the community committee? Yes. Do I firmly believe that a beautiful new pool and purpose-built library will be a massive asset to Milton? Also, a resounding yes. The Council and Bruce Communities Facility Trust know that there are a lot of questions around this project. Hopefully many of these will be answered in the consultation document but we will be holding sessions for the public to come, hear more and discuss the project further. There will be a drop-in session at the Tokomairiro Community Hub on Wednesday 15th June from 1-3pm. There will also be an information display and "post-it" note wall for gathering comments at the Hub over the next month, so please feel free to drop in. SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Kia ora,
The end of Semester One is approaching rapidly and there has been lots of interruptions that have affected student learning. In order to allow for this, we have designated June 17th as a catch-up day for students. Students who need a bit of extra intensive 1:1 instruction will have the opportunity to do just that. We are in the process of identifying those students and they will receive an invite to attend on June 17th where an individual programme will be available to them. A student could study English all day if necessary or jump between several subject in order to get the support they need. In this way we feel that they can draw a line under Semester One's studies and start afresh in Semester Two. Wellbeing is a catchphrase used very frequently and this is one way we are contributing to student wellbeing by allowing them the extra time needed to get work done and to ensure that the efforts put in during semester one are not wasted.

The Education review office are making their first visit to us on 9th and 10 June to identify what we can do better and offer the help and support to ensure this happens. They have adapted their approach to reviews, and this is a 2-year review where they continually visit and support us, rather

than the one visit for 3-4 days and not seen again for another three years. We are looking forward to working with them as we progress.

Our staff are beginning to succumb to covid infections and at the moment our ultimate goal is to remain open fully for students, but this is becoming more and more difficult. We are planning on a daily basis how we manage the situation. Currently we are joining classes where possible and teachers are surrendering their non-contact time to take classes of teachers who are away, but eventually, we will have to concede that we cannot function effectively with larger numbers of staff being unavailable for a week at a time. Therefore, we are advising that sometime in the near future we may have to roster home our senior students and provide online learning opportunities for them. Apologies for any inconvenience this may cause and we will operate as normal for as long as is feasible.

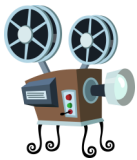
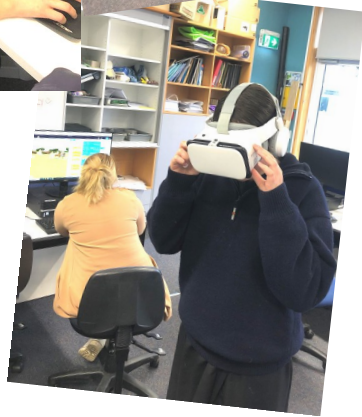
