

teachers are working under. A colleague of mine is currently in Australia on a conference and had found the following information regarding condition over there.

A starting salary for a teacher is \$75,000 in Australia with our teachers starting on \$51,000. This is a difference of \$24,000. This is only one aspect of the current strike action as we attempt to attract quality staff in the profession after a period of 3-4 years of paid study. They are beginning work for less money and attempting to pay off a university debt and secure accommodation etc. This makes the profession less attractive to good candidates.

Having said that, there is some frustration regarding the current actions being taken by the PPTA and their targeting of students, which their members are obliged to comply with. However, we should note the MoE's poor handling of the current education sector issues.

Teachers are being asked to manage huge changes currently. There is a curriculum refresh meaning the whole New Zealand curriculum from Years 0-13 is changing and teachers need to be aware of this. Some of the work was started last Friday the 5th of May. NCEA is also changing at the same time creating a lot of extra stress and workload for teachers at this time.

We also have the major attendance issues that the country is dealing with, which has a knock-on effect in our classrooms as we do not have the consistent time with some students who
