Farewell to Long-Standing Staff

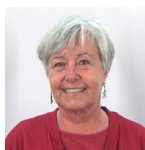
At the end of Term One, Tokomairiro High School farewelled two long serving staff members.

French Students Enjoy Café Experience

At the end of the term, Year 7/8TH recently completed their 'taster' course in French. Students spent approximately 18 lessons learning a little about French culture and language.

Even though this is a short course, students learn that though there are differences, there are many ways that we connect with other cultures. They were able to make links between some aspects of Maori and French culture such as the hongi and 'la bise', the French greeting of kissing people on each cheek 2-4 times, and the vowel sounds which are also similar. They also made links between the meanings of some French and English words. Most students were surprised to learn that French-speaking New Caledonia, not Australia, is actually our closest neighbour in terms of flight times.

To give students an authentic reason to use some of the language they have learned, we usually hold a 'French café' at the end of the term. Students have to greet their serveuse/waitress, use their manners and order their food and drink all in French. This is a fun, successful occasion as students are keen to eat the croissants and pain au chocolat.

Students can choose to develop their French skills in Years 9 and 10.

SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Kia ora,

Welcome back to an exciting Term 2. This is always a busy time for schools as we work hard to ensure that students are well prepared for the rest of the year and avoid the inevitable pressures students put themselves under as they attempt to catch up on the work they have to complete before exams etc. An added stress is the proposed industrial action that is planned for this term. Teachers in the PPTA (Post Primary Teachers Association) will be stepping up the level of action they are taking. There are several new things to add to the mix.

Firstly, teachers will not be covering other classes for absent or ill teachers so once again all schools will be drawing on a small pool of relievers and we will do our best to ensure that we can remain open for business as often as possible with minimal disruption to learning. A new aspect includes staff not being available for after school meetings in our case no meetings will take place after 4.15 pm. Therefore, we are unlikely to hold any parent teacher conference this term. There will be a strike day for our region on Tuesday 9th May and finally rostering home of students in particular year groups. These are as follows:

- May 4th Year 11 students rostered home.
- 11th May Year 13 students rostered home.
- 16th May Year 9 students rostered home.
- 17th May Year 10 students rostered home.
- 25th May Year 11 students rostered home.

30th May Year 13 students rostered home.
 1st June Year 12 students rostered home.
 6th June Year 10 students rostered home.
 8th June Year 9 students rostered home.
 Our Year 12 students were supposed to be rostered home on the 9th May also but this coincides with our regional strike which is why they do not appear twice on the above list. This is the action is currently in place and may change if the situation changes.
 The school will also be closed on Friday 5th May as all teachers are required to participate in some professional development as part of the new curriculum refresh being rolled out by the Government and Ministry of Education. The school was also involved in a meeting towards the end of last term to discuss the issues being created by a group of youths around Milton. This will be an ongoing process as we all work together to mitigate the negative influence these individuals are having on our community. We are aware that some but not all of these individuals are also part of our school community, and we will do all we can to support them through their education and also engage with the wider community action also. I use the word "support" very specifically as carrot is always better than a stick in these circumstances.

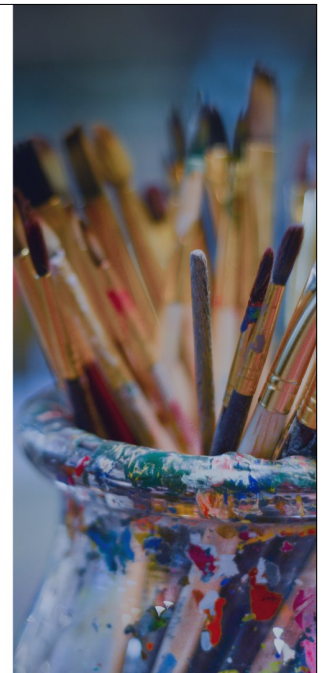
