

It's easy to assume everyone knows what bullying is. But often the term bullying is used to describe other aggressive behaviour. This can make it hard for schools and caregivers to deal with bullying when it does happen.

The most widely-accepted definitions of bullying are based on four elements: bullying is deliberate, harmful, involves a power imbalance, and has an element of repetition.

Bullying can happen anywhere, in person or online (cyberbullying), at any time, and can be verbal, physical or social (relational).

As a school we do not think bullying is acceptable in any circumstances. We also believe that we can tackle bullying and the most effective way to do this is as a whole school community.

To be able to do this we need to have a shared understanding of what bullying is, to identify when bullying is happening and to respond to bullying. One thing that can really help to tackle bullying is to develop a culture of upstanders.

In a bullying situation, an upstander is someone who recognises when something is wrong and does something to make it right. If an upstander sees or hears about bullying, he or she will do something about it. This could mean stopping the bully, reporting the event, or otherwise helping the victim even after the fact.

On the other hand, a bystander is someone who sees bullying happening and does nothing to stop it. People who laugh at something mean a bully says or don't say anything when they see bullying happening are bystanders. By doing nothing, the bystander is negatively contributing to the bullying situation.

We understand that there are many reasons someone may not be an upstander, they are often afraid of retaliation or that their own group of friends will exclude them. But there are ways in our school that students can come forward and tell trusted adults about situations.

I could guarantee that if I asked any student in our school whether bullying was okay they would say no. So I truly believe that if we work together as a school community that we can make a difference.


