Welcome to another week where we are grateful that the inclement weather has not reached us and we can concentrate and focus our efforts on our studies. We are all sympathetic to the plight of our friends' families and colleagues who are being hit once again with some pretty severe weather conditions. Reading and Writing: real-life skills

We often get media stories about the low levels of reading and writing for students in our New Zealand schools.

In recent years, many employers have expressed concern about young people struggling with essential reading and writing tasks required in their jobs. The education sector has also expressed concerns.

In response to these concerns, as part of the forthcoming changes in NCEA, students will be required to pass a separate reading and writing assessment in order to get NCEA. Our current Year 9 students will be the first to have access to these assessments. They will need to be able to demonstrate understanding of real world texts. For example, they could be asked to read a selection of advertisements about cleaning services, and select the company which will help to solve a particular issue and explain why that would be. Writing is expected to be accurate: students must be able to communicate in a range of situations.

How is this different from what is currently the case with NCEA? Since 2012, students have been able to gain literacy credits in a variety of subjects. So if the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) has said this particular standard in Science, PE, Maths, Food Technology requires a certain level of literacy, students will automatically be awarded literacy when they pass that standard. The teachers of those subjects did not have to check for spelling, punctuation or grammar. Yes, they might be able to achieve the particular subject task, but they did not necessarily have to do it in a literate way. This is why, in recent years, some of our students have gained Literacy without credits in English. How can you help your children with reading and writing literacy at home? Allow time for reading for enjoyment, and for shared reading. Enable your children to participate in all those household tasks which require literacy: get them to write the shopping lists; get them to help you word that letter or email of concern where you are expressing a point of view

or asking for information. In essence, make time for reading and writing at home, and keep up to date with where your children are with respect to their reading and writing. You might not want to wait for report times or parent evenings. That is fine. Just contact your school. There will be people there to help you with your questions.

Ear Service in Milton

Since January 2023 Ruth O'Neill of Wax Out (a travelling health professional) has been offering ear wax removal micro-suction clinics at the Tokomairiro Community Hub here in Milton


I am an experienced registered nurse, with extensive general practitioner work, who has been specially trained in micro-suction. Micro-suction involves using a specially designed head torch with magnification called an OScope. This is used to carefully examine the ear canal, then using a fine, low pressure suction device the ear wax and debris is removed. This is all done under direct vision meaning I can directly view the ear canal and ear wax with the OScope and suck the wax out at the same time. Compare this to ear syringing, where ear wax is flushed out without a view of the canal, meaning it is being done 'blind'. Micro-suction is less invasive than ear syringing and has less chance of causing pain and infection. If you experience hearing loss, feedback/ whistling from wearing hearing aids, feeing of fullness, itching, pain, tinnitus, discharge or odour you may have a wax build up. If you feel you have a wax build up it is a good idea to administer olive oil drops twice a day for three to five days prior to attending your appointment. I will be at the Tokomairiro Community Hub fortnightly on a Tuesday and occasional Thursday evenings. This month I have a Thursday evening clinic on 16th February 5-8:30pm, and Tuesday 21st February 8:20-2:40pm. No referral is necessary, you can call or text me on 027-419-6463 for an appointment. My costs are reasonable, \$50/adult, \$25 follow -up, \$40 Child/Student, \$20 follow-up. I will be advertising once a month the clinics that will be available in the Milton area. I look forward to hearing from you.

From the Mathematics Department

The Mathematics Department is off to a positive start in 2023 by welcoming Erica Milligan and Sharlene Goodwin into the Department. With the Census fast approaching for all of us in the community, Year 7-10 will be investigating Statistics and how the census provides integral information which allows decisions to be made about future infrastructure, projects and spending. It also gives us the opportunity to learn about each other and connect to our community.

In the Senior School, all Year 11 students are starting the year by completing a numeric reasoning NCEA standard which sets a foundation for the rest of the year. Year 12 are completing Simulations, which ties into the Mathematical of elements of chance and experimental concepts Year 13 Statistics has started the statistics. investigating Bivariate Data using data sets of runners from last year's Boston Marathon. Calculus students have started the year with Critical Path Analysis - learning how to network projects and use Mathematical reasoning to order and reorganise tasks from a calculus perspective.

Financial Literacy also returns to the Mathematics department in 2023. It is a unit standard based course that allows students to learn about banking, goal setting, home purchasing, insurance, personal income, investing and taxation. It remains a popular subject that can be taken for

The Rebus Club of Milton

The last meeting for 2022 was held at the Waihola Tavern. . Thankyou to all at the tavern for accommodating us.

The speaker was James Pemberton, a cardiologist from Dunedin Hospital. He trained in Newcastle, UK, worked in the US before moving to New Zealand and has been in Dunedin for seven years. He works with others in the Echo department; his main work being the insertion of pacemakers and treatment of congenital heart disease. He is often on call.

Pacemakers are mini computers that regulate the heartbeat, filling in where beats are missed. They are checked once a year with a magnet that "talks" to the pacemaker and is able to reprogramme it if necessary. Other devices sometimes needed are small defibrillators which can shock the heart if it stops, and stents which are metal scaffolds, used to enlarge and support blood vessels which have narrowed. These can be inserted without the need for open heart surgery.

Drugs are important for treatment to prevent further problems. Heart tissue forms scars rather than repair so prompt attention is vital for the best outcome. James had samples of the devices to illustrate exactly what he was talking about. He also answered questions from interested listeners. James was thanked by Donald Gordon and given a gift of fruit.




