Taking the Time to Read a Book....

A focus for English learning is the improvement of reading and writing skills so that students are prepared for their future. Research continues to emphasize that those students who engage in recreational reading are more likely to be successful in their studies. This is why there has been and continues to be encouragement for students to read both at school and at home. Reading provides a whole lot of benefits for the brain: it grows the brain, develops vocabulary, reflection, imagination and empathy. It helps people have a stronger sense of their place in the world too. A big benefit for all of us is that it assists with aging; not to mention the joy that can come from escape into reading. In recent years, many employers have commented on the need for their workers to be more literate in reading and writing. It is not enough to be able to read and write at a basic level: students need the skills to be able to function in the modern world.

Along with reading and writing, there is also a need for students to be confident in their speaking, so this is also a focus at various stages of their learning in this subject; at some stage there will be a family event where they will need to speak in public.

Increasingly, there is a need for students to understand the visual messages they receive via film, and other media. Last year, Media




