Our focus in assembly this week was on the importance of regular attendance at school. We monitor attendance very carefully and celebrate each term those students who have the top levels of attendance. This week we celebrated all those students who had achieved at least 95% attendance for the year in 2019. These young people are great examples to others.

Attendance

By international standards, regular attendance at school is measured as being at school 90% of class time. At Tokomairiro High School one of our annual targets for the past few years has been 90% attendance across all year levels. Research shows that every day away from school can affect results. The Associate Minister of Education stated that for students attending 95% of days in year 10 later get an average of 75 credits at NCEA Level 3 - more than enough to gain the qualification. On the other hand, for students attending for 85% of the time, only about half go on to achieve NCEA Level 3.

In 2019 the average attendance rate for all students was 85% and only 43.5% of our students had at least 90% attendance; this compared to a national average of 57.7%.

Distance vision (Amblyopia & Hyperopia) determines how well your child is able to see at a distance. It involves reading an eye chart (not required if your child wears glasses). If you **do not wish your child to be screened**, please fill out an opt-out slip, which is available at the school office, before the visit.


After lunch the monthly meeting was held. Preparations for Mid Otago A.G.M. were made.


