Tokomairiro High School would like to acknowledge the passing of Colin Mitchell, who passed away on July 8th after a short illness.

Colin took on many roles in many departments around the school over nearly 25 years. He



was first employed as a tutor in motor mechanics, having shared his skills at Toko Training. Plenty of students will have fond memories of being taken flying with Colin on the completion of their small motors course, doing 270km/hr as they circled the Octagon (and being told they could never beat that in a car!!) He moved on to become a Teacher Aide in the Technology Department maintaining the tools and sharing his wealth of knowledge with students.

He worked in the Horticulture Department, maintaining equipment and often in his own time. Sue Nelson remembers looking out her classroom window quite a few years ago to see him repairing a shed roof—no safety gear in sight, just getting on with the job!

He also drove students on various trips including to Telford and Dunedin, for visits to Otago Polytech and other trips.

He carried out electrical testing for the school, a huge undertaking which took most of the April school holidays. He was also responsible for the overseeing of the school vans, ensuring they were fit to drive, doing minor repairs and keeping RUC's and registrations up to date.

Part of a poem in the service sheet from Colin's funeral sums him up perfectly:

I never tried to be great or grand, I tried to be a helping hand.

If I helped in a team, if I helped on my own, It was more than repaid by good family and friends I have known;

And if I went the extra mile, I did it with pleasure—it was all worthwhile.
