## Launch Celebrated in Home Town

Wednesday 30th March, 2022 ex-pupils Heidi Renata and Steven Renata were thrilled to celebrate the global launch of their new youth pathways app in the town and school that it all began.

Mana Rangatahi was a programme designed by Heidi Renata, Co-Founder and Chief Energy Officer of INNOV8HQ in 2019, to provide a platform and community that developed resilience for youth as they navigate their future pathways. The programme has been written as Heidi's living workbook for youth to be able to explore more about themselves and the importance of establishing values to assist in guiding them towards the businesses they want to launch or work for. In 2021, in partnership with Transition to Work Trust, INNOV8HQ was funded by the Otago Community Trust to expand its programme and reach, and in collaboration with big brother Steve's business called Kiwa Digital, a world leading media production company, the siblings co-designed the new Mana Rangatahi app which has now gone global. This free resource is the programme handbook that has been designed with the intention to introduce youth to framework that celebrates their blended heritage and how this foundation can position unique opportunities and possibilities when modelled and executed well.

## Senior Biology



The students in Mrs Lata's Yr 12 and 13 Biology class have been doing a unit on Genetic Engineering. They are learning the technique of Plant Tissue Culturing. The students are taking grape vine nodes, stems and leaves and putting them into an Agar plate culture for propagation to take place. These are being sealed to prevent air getting in, and are then placed in an incubator to regulate constant temperature. The outcome should be that it will grow into a callus which eventually will grow into a grape vine shoot.

# Tokomairiro High School Newsletter...

**SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.**

Kia ora,

You'll be aware that Minister of Education Chris Hipkins announced the move to Orange on Wednesday 13th April.

The decision to move to Orange has been made on public health advice and reflects that we are moving past the peak of cases and our health system is able to cope. We are seeing that cases are declining due to high levels of vaccination and natural immunity after infection.

I wanted to give you an update on what the move to Orange means for our school.

At Orange, face masks are no longer required at school. However public health advice is that masks continue to be strongly encouraged when indoors. Wearing a mask is a key health measure that slows the spread of COVID-19 in indoor settings. For that reason, we ask that visitors to the school, including parents and whānau, wear a mask whenever they are indoors on school grounds.

We also ask that your child (if they are Year 7+) continues to bring a mask to school every day. There may be times that we'll ask them to wear a mask, too – for example, when we are having an assembly in the hall. If there are a high number of cases at school or in the community, we may ask that masks are worn in classrooms for a time.

At Orange, students aged 12 and above are still required to wear a face mask on school or public transport.

We will continue to keep all the other health measures in place at school that we know slow the spread of COVID-19. These include ensuring our indoor spaces are well-ventilated, maintaining good hand hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette, appropriate physical distancing whenever we can and, most importantly, staying home if we are sick.

We are looking forward to a few less restrictions and returning to school life that is a bit closer to normal.

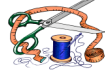
