Let's go Timberwolves!




Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May was a teacher only day and the majority of staff attended some specific professional development with regard to the changes that are happening to the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA). There are seven big changes, listed below and we need to be familiar with these and adapt our planning and delivery of the curriculum as a result. Math's, science and music had subject specific professional development in Dunedin. The rest of the staff attended South Otago High School where we also met up with Catlins area school and in subject areas looked at the new standards and collaborated and shared ideas as to how we would teach these standards. It was a great opportunity for our new staff particularly to make contact with their colleagues and also for our experienced teachers to reestablish the professional working relations with other colleagues. Lots of questions were asked and many were answered. The Ministry has made provision for three more days for this training and we will make sure students and parents are aware of these dates. Currently our next date will fall between the following dates 15<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> August and the final two days for this year will fall between 21<sup>st</sup> November and 2<sup>nd</sup> December. We need to liaise with other schools and work around each other's calendars so I can't be more specific at this time.

We have been working on these changes for almost two years now and looking at the list below we are currently working through numbers 4 and 5 on this list. I am sure some of this might be confusing for parents and we hope to have an explanation evening for parents and students once these become part of our curriculum. The date for implementation had been pushed back as a result of Covid interruptions. Its important to note that some of our senior students have had their education and examinations interrupted twice so another big change for them was deemed unfair. So it is planned that these changes will largely come into effect in 2024 for level 1 students (Year 11, our current year 9 cohort) Level 2 in 2025 after and finally Level 3 in 2026, although there are pilots in certain subject and with limited schools in place at the moment. This does not currently affect us. Our current year 9's will have a very interesting and challenging time ahead of them and we are working hard to give them the skills they need to succeed.

Make NCEA more accessible – zero fees, fewer barriers for learners with disabilities and learning support needs.

Equal status for mātauranga Māori in NCEA – develop new ways to recognise mātauranga Māori, build teacher capability, and improve resourcing and support for Māori learners and te ao Māori pathways.

Strengthen literacy and numeracy requirements and assessments - ensure students with an NCEA have functional literacy and numeracy skills that will ready them to transition into tertiary education or the workplace.




