Community Project to Support New Mothers

Blessed Box was born out of a desire to provide better postpartum support to mothers with new babies in the Clutha District. Motherhood is challenging in general, however the first 6 weeks postpartum can be a particularly challenging time in a mother's life – sleep deprivation, breast feeding challenges, hormonal, relational and environmental changes are just some of the challenge's mothers experience during this time. It's a big period of adjustment whether you are a first-time mother or you are welcoming additional children.

The postpartum period is one of the most vulnerable periods of a woman's life. It is more likely for a woman to experience new onset of a mental illness during the first year postpartum than any other time in her life! And with everything that happens during that time, it makes sense.

This new community project aims to provide practical support for all mothers with a new baby by providing a beautifully curated box, containing a prepared family meal, cupcakes and a breastfeeding/ sleep deprivation snack pack for a Mother with a new baby, in the Clutha District, free of charge.

We hope that with this gesture, we can cultivate a community that sees the importance and value of fully supported mothers (and families) for our society. It's something we'd love to see our community get on board with, to unite and support our districts mothers! The first cook will occur on the last Saturday of January 2021 to create Blessed Boxes for mothers who are due in December 2020
