Tokomairiro Forestry Pathways End of Term Report

All eleven students are progressing well on this course, with positive feedback from the schools that they are enrolled in. One student from East Otago High is now ready and wanting to go into full time work. He has a position available to him with Steve Johnson Forestry Services

Various industry site visits, along with a visit to the Dunedin Botanical gardens to look at tree identification have happened this term.

Practical pruning and tree selection has also been a major focus this term, with all students having now completed Unit Standard 22998 (Demonstrate Knowledge of pruning plantation trees and prune plantation trees under supervision.) Students have now completed both practical and theory pruning exercises They are presently working on practical plotting and planting along with the completion of Unit Standard 23000 (Demonstrate Knowledge of plantation forest establishment operations and perform an established task under supervision). This module is at Level 2 and worth 10 credits.

Three students are taking the opportunity to do work experience planting trees with Johnson Forestry over the school holidays. This may lead to full time permanent employment for them. Good on these students for taking the chances and giving it a go !!!!

It was lovely to have eight Year 11 students to visit Toko Training last week for our open

Luncheon. The boys were very attentive. Alistair (forestry tutor) gave the boys an insight into what is happening on the programme and what Toko Training is able to offer students who may wish to stay enrolled at school. At the same time, skills and knowledge can be gained for employment in the primary sector in particular forestry. The students can also obtain up to 70 credits at both Levels 2 & 3 on the NZQA framework.

Loves Me Not Programme for Year 12s

In New Zealand police respond to a family harm incident every four minutes, we also have one of the highest rates of domestic violence in the developed world.

Last Wednesday, our Year 12 students learned more about this and took part in the Loves Me Not programme. They learned about Sophie Elliot and her story and took away skills that they can use in their relationships now and in the future. Students learned about power and control in relationships and what these might look like and the importance of sticking up for your mates.

In the afternoon we learned about bystanders and consent, it was great to hear students from our school able to talk about the importance of being an "upstander". This has been an important message at our school for the past year, so it is great to see this sinking in for our students.

Gregg Caldwell, of Milton, explained what his new business Southern Recycling – is all about. He and his business partner have set up a plant in Stirling with new equipment which has just arrived from China. The object is to recycle ewaste; that is anything that uses a plug (except for old heavy TVs!). These include computers, mobile phones, laptops, tablets, photocopiers, printers, washing machines, dryers the list goes on!

The material will be reduced to a reusable state saving so much space in landfill. Ultimately it is hoped that tyres, farmers' bale wrap, glass and other plastics will also be recycled for reuse, even clothing with plastic content.

As well as providing a much needed business in South Otago, to keep the plant running, there will be employment opportunities. Councils are keen to support Gregg as are other businesses.

Gregg is a true Eco Warrior and it is great to have someone with the passion and drive to set up such a beneficial business in our local district.
