Leaving Gift Commissioned

Glenis Sim, retiring Principal of Tokomairiro High School, commissioned this piece as a leaving gift from herself to the school.

This taonga was carved by Ben Whitaker, Ngāti Hako, Ngāti Tamaterā, Ngā Puhi. Ben is a local artist and educator based in Owaka.

This carving represents Taonga Tuku Iho, treasures passed down from one generation to the next. Two manaia (spiritual guardians)

meet in the middle through their mouths, emphasizing the importance of korero for learning and understanding. The whakarei design that adorns the carving is the 'Ritorito' pattern which acknowledges the centre shoot of the flax plant. Māori understood the flax plant to represent a whānau unit, where the centre shoot, the Ritorito, was the child, protected and developed by the parents and grandparents (outer leaves). This ideology is further extended in the whakatauki "Unuhia te rito o te harakeke".


This carving uses whakairo, a traditional mode of transmitting mātauranga Māori to share key cultural concepts with the community of learners at Tokomairiro High School. It speaks to the symbiotic relationship between teacher and student and how we rely on the past to navigate our future.

New Learning Pathway Successful

This year, three Tokomairiro High School students have begun an exciting new educational pathway. Hope Hunt, Kieren Haar (both Year 10) and Sylah Daniel (Year 9) have started working towards their New Zealand Certificate in Skills for Living, an NZQA-Approved Course through South Pacific Education Courses (SPEC). They will continue to work on the Certificate over the next few years, choosing from a variety of modules (11 in total) in the areas of Vocational Skills, Life Skills, Transition, Community Work, Leisure and the Environment.

Through these contexts, they will have many opportunities to engage with learning that is relevant to them, develop essential life skills, improve their literacy and numeracy skills, and build self confidence. The New Zealand Certificate in Skills for Living qualification focuses on developing competencies needed for lifelong learning, including further study, employment and preparing young people to become contributing citizens.

The trio have successfully completed two modules this year-working towards the 11 they need. They received their certificates in last week's Junior Prizegiving.

Several other students will join them next year, as they too begin working on their NZ Certificate in Skills for Living. Keep up the good work, guys!

Junior Whakairo Course 2021



"Arotahi ana te titiro iho a te kārearea, tau ana! If we focus entirely on what needs to be done, we will achieve what we set out to do."

Tokomairiro High School Junior Whakairo students Nikora, Cy, Tane and Hayden showed focus and perseverance to complete their Pou during Terms 3 and 4, working only two hours a week, with the delays of Covid added to the mix.

The medium of carving was used to explore whakapapa, pūrākau and tikanga Māori. The designs of these Pou represent the key Māori concept of duality, with Rongomātāne and Tūmatauenga, the gods of peace and war. Carving practice reinforced this learning with big, hard hits to develop the form (Tū), and soft hits to create finer details (Rongo).

It was a privilege to watch these tauira grow and develop as young men this year. As reflection on our mahi, I asked them some questions about what they enjoyed, were challenged by, learned about themselves or developed throughout the carving process. Their answers blew me away, showing the depth of learning and transferable skills gained which they can apply to all areas. Here are some of their responses.

"Feel more confident, like I couldn't do it at the start but I can now." "Proud."

"We learnt to work together."

"I have more respect for my work and for others and I built more respect for the people that I was doing it with."

"I built more self respect and I built more self control. When I was angry... I just came in here and did more work and it kind of pushed that anger out."

"Feels really good that we finished something big like this." Ka rawe tō koutou mahi Nikora and Cy, Tane and Hayden! I am excited for next year and look forward to helping you build on your learning. Ngā mihi., Ben.

Tokomairiro Training End of Year Report

2021 has brought some challenges to Tokomairiro Training. Recruitment for both the Youth Guarantee and the Alternative Education programmes has been more challenging this year and in particular the Covid- 19 lockdowns being a hindrance to both enrolments and the retention of students. Despite the smaller throughput this year, our contractual outcomes with the Tertiary Education Commission have been met with funding secured for 2022.

To the contrary, the Forestry Pathways Course, which was oversubscribed, has been an enormous success and all the eleven students enrolled, have moved into full time employment or further training. The course for 2022 is attracting a lot of interest from a number of schools.

Ongoing sustainable Government funding continues to be a major issue for this forestry programme.

It has been a pleasure to have had eight students from Tokomairiro High School complete a taster course at Toko Training. This course gave the year eleven students not only an opportunity to experience what the forestry industry in general has to offer in the way of future employment, but also they all gained a number of level one and two credits towards their NCEA. The standards covered a number of areas including Health and Safety, Health and Wellbeing, and basic chainsaw use and maintenance.

Positive student course evaluations are a true reflection on how much the eleven students from the Pathways and the eight students from the High School Taster courses proved to be successful.

During the last week of school, Tokomairiro junior students had the opportunity to do a few different activities. Two of these included walking McNally's track with Mr Gilling and Mr Robertson, and enjoying a day doing beach activites.

Note from Milton Medical Centre

At Milton Medical Centre we prioritise your health, safety and wellbeing above all else. In this climate of Covid-19 we know that some places have been a source of transmission and spread so we are taking steps to ensure that we are not one of those places here.

Anyone presenting with Covid-19 symptoms or Covid-19 risk factors could potentially have Covid-19 and is therefore classed as a Red Stream patient. Anyone else seeking care that does not have any Covid-19 symptoms or risk factors is classed as Green Stream. Please help us protect everyone by disclosing any symptoms or factors that make you a Red Stream patient.

We are ensuring our Red Stream and Green Stream patients do not cross paths in the Milton Medical Centre building. Our practitioner's will be looking after Red Stream patients at designated times each day and will be seeing them in our allocated Red Room cabin in the carpark. Please phone us on arrival and wait in your car until it is your turn to be seen. You can pay online or at a later time.

Most Red Stream patients will be offered a COVID-19 test and will not be seen until the test result is available, unless there is an acute need. When you get a call from the Phone Triage clinician please let them know if you urgently require a GP consult in the Red Room, or if you just want a quick COVID-19 swab and are happy managing your symptoms at home until your test results are returned for you to be seen face-to-face.

If you have a health concern that is not related to a Covid-19 symptom and you are a low risk for having Covid-19 you are in the Green Stream. Please wait in your car until your appointment time and only enter the waiting room at the last moment

Regardless of whether you are Red or Green you are kindly asked to wear a mask or use a face covering if you are visiting at our practice. The Red and Green Streams only apply to face-to-face consultations.

Whilst we realise that the incidence of Covid-19 is currently low in our community we are still taking these measures as a precaution against its transmission and spread to help protect you, your family, our staff and our community.

We will be closed on the public holiday stat days and have reduced staff on over the holiday period so please arrange for any regular prescriptions to be renewed early.

We wish all our patients and the wonderful people of our community a happy, healthy festive season and thank you for your support throughout the year. Merry Christmas to you all.

Waihola Playground **Redevelopment Project**

The Waihola Playground Development Project began in late 2019, with a vision to replace equipment and create an environment that will provide activities and experiences for all to enjoy, providing intergenerational play for young and old alike.

Recently, the deposit was paid to Otago Engineering Ltd, to begin manufacturing for Stage One - a paddle steamer and quad swing set.

The Paddle steamer (see plan below), has 22 features at different levels. (i.e. ground level entry to enable all ages and abilities to enjoy higher levels for others).

An historical presence of paddle steamers on Lake Waihola (late 1800s) has given the town an opportunity to link the playground redevelopment to that history.

Suitable history boards will be located within the area on completion. Some locals may remember the Douglas" as one of those early paddle steamers.






