Sharing Skills to Build A School

Myself and Marty Clark have just returned from Amelvet Village which is small village on the island of Malekula the second biggest island in Vanuatu. It is approximately a one hour flight from Port Vila (the main settlement) in a small plane.

The project was driven by Dunedin North Rotary and when Les Wilson, an ex-Milton Rotarian, came down to Milton Rotary to raise funds and seek labour he was thrilled when he got interest from myself and Marty Clark—both builders albeit one slightly worn out! However the ball was now rolling and Milton Rotary agreed to pay for myself and Marty's airfares and accommodation.

The building was all metal construction, all prefabbed and the concrete foundation was already in place when Marty and I arrived on site on the 7th June, We had about four local labourers available to us and over the next two weeks we largely had the building finished. The accomodation consisted of a very basic little house within the Amelvet school that has about 400 kids, with no power, long drop toilets , showering with buckets of water and cooking over an open fire. The lack of facilities was more than made up for in hospitality and the locals really looked after us.

A highlight for Marty and I was the school kids singing and dancing and on our last night they gave us special show completely surrounding our wee house and sung to us. We both came away feeling really fortunate for what we have here in NZ, and can see that even without all the things that we have, the kids seem to be completely happy.

Support Staff Week

From 1 July, we'll be directly managing water services for the Clutha District.

To prepare for this, around 24 dedicated waters staff are starting work to look after the water and wastewater treatment plants that provide for around 14,600 people in 15 towns and at more than 2,000 rural properties.

You'll still be able to contact us in the same ways as before.

We've been working hard to prepare for this, but it will take some time for everything to be up and running as smoothly as we'd like - it's a big change.

The Clutha District is large, we have 2,500 kilometres of pipes to look after, so to help us we've hired some local contractors too.

We'll continue to prioritise requests for service across the district, fixing issues in order of priority rather than based on where or when they were reported.
