
Athletics Day Records Broken

Millar McElrea broke 3 records at our school athletics day held 26 February 2020.

Millar was competing in the intermediate boys group and ran 400m in 56.42 sec breaking the previous record of 57.01 sec set in 1987 by David Sullivan

Millar broke the high jump record with a height of 1.7m the previous record was held by Macy Deans at 1.69m in 1998. Millar also broke the Long jump record, with a distance of 5.92m the previous record was held by Cory Innes at 5.81m in 2000.





Ethan Walker National Athletics Championships 6 & 7 March

Congratulations to Ethan Walker on a successful trip to the National Athletics Championships held in Christchurch over the weekend.

In the under 20 Javelin competition on Friday, Ethan threw a personal best with a 800 gm javelin of 59.74 meter's. A gold medal and an impressive 12 meter's ahead of the silver medal winner and 16 meter's ahead of the bronze medal winner.

On Saturday Ethan competed in the senior men's event. He didn't throw quite as good as Friday, but he still managed 54.96 meter's, earning a bronze medal. The winner threw 68.71 meter's.

Ethan is now ranked No. 1 in New Zealand for under 20 javelin and No. 3 for the senior men.

At the February meeting, Katrina Newdick, from the Mosgiel ANZ Bank, spoke about the many and varied scams which are so prevalent in our lives. They can be a phone call, text message or email and are now so believable that anyone can get caught. The scams come in waves and continue until they are not profitable, when a new one will appear. Advice Katrina offered was:

- 1. Never download anything to your computer unless you are absolutely sure of its source. (It could include a virus!)
- 2. <u>Never</u> give out your password or pin number or other personal information. (Banks are getting tougher now and if you have released your password or pin number to anyone, they won't cover your loss).
- 3. Don't click on a link if you are not sure.
- **4.** To check if it is a scam, ring 0800CERTNZ or look up NETSAFE.org.nz.
- 5. If it looks or sounds too good to be true, IT IS!
- **6.** Don't send money to anyone without checking with them. Your computer may have been hacked.

If you think you have been scammed, ring the bank to get your account blocked immediately. Voice ID is now available with ANZ. Do use any extra security your bank offers. A debit card is safer than a credit card to use for online shopping.

The last piece of advice was to get the message out about scams. The more we know, they less we will get caught.
