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Water - A Vital and Precious Resource!

Waihola District School children have been learning about water, investigating where our water comes from, how much of the world's water is available and the wide range of activities and life forms that rely on us having access to clean, fresh water. Children of all ages undertook a water audit - investigating how water gets to us at school and home, and what happens to the waste water we create. They monitored their own use of water over time and made efforts to reduce their use and waste of this resource. Children have made various models to explain the water cycle and explore how water moves within our catchment. The children have generated questions and started to research who and how water is managed in our local area. Laura Gourley, Environmental Education adviser from the CDC, visited us with a new Enviroscape model to show how our water can easily become contaminants into

land is cleared for building, agriculture or industry. The children were able to see how rainfall and run-off could carry contaminants into streams, rivers, lakes or the ocean. They could see that taking action, such as riparian planting, could reduce the negative impact of run off on the water quality in our streams and rivers. Children investigated the states and properties of water, evaporation, surface tension, how some things dissolve in water, and other

Students predicted how many drops of water would sit on a coin and discussed how water molecules stick together, observing how they formed a dome on the coin.

The Rebus Club of Milton

President Alan Strain welcomed members to the meeting on September 15. Our speaker was Steve Newall, who has a nursery at Finegand. He described his job of 25 years as seed collecting, with a bit of water sampling now as well. Although his Dad is a keen gardener, his interest began when he was working in the Eglinton Valley. The variety of plants to be found around the roadsides fascinated him and he started collecting their seeds. This became three months a year gathering seed and the other nine as house husband. A German company saw the potential for NZ's unique seeds to be harvested here and sent overseas to be sold to keen collectors worldwide. He has been five times to Europe (all expenses paid) to talk about NZ flora. He also spent a lot of time in the USA collecting seed.

Now he makes money from weeds. Marram grass seed sells for \$500/kg and in one shipment, bales totalling 100kg were sent. This is grown overseas and used for grass roofs on houses. Likewise, pampas grass is popular although it is regarded more as a weed here.

Steve was thanked by Noel Aitken and given a thank you gift of fruit and a petrol voucher.

The next meeting is on Tuesday October 20 at 10.00 am at the RSA hall. Committee please meet at 9.30 am. The morning tea will be followed by a brief meeting and cars will be organised to take members to visit Sarah Gillies at her home to look at her metal sculptures and plants.
