

Chromebooks - Our Year 11 students are permitted to take home a school Chromebook. There is a \$50 bond to be paid which will be refunded if Chromebook comes back in working and tidy condition upon leaving school. This can be paid via internet banking, Eftpos or cash, bank details are: 03 1736 0009803 00 (Please reference *child's name* and *Chromebook*). Any damages eg broken screens, loss of charger during the year will incur the repair/replacement cost. If you do not wish your child to take the Chromebook home, we can store it in the office and your child can collect it in the morning and drop it back off at the end of day. Bond still applies. Year 12 and 13 students who did not hand their Chromebook in at the end of last year

will need to bring it with charger on subject confirmation day Wednesday 25th January for inspection and to be reactivated. Students who did hand their Chromebook in can collect it from the school office.
