

# NCEA Exams at Tokomairiro High School

We take this opportunity to acknowledge and congratulate our tauira and their caregivers for making it through the NCEA Exam period. We are extremely proud of students who put time into their revision, turned up and gave the exams their best effort. Even though this time can be challenging and stressful, we are confident that our learners will make us proud when results are released mid-January. Tokomairiro High School staff LOVE giving learners the opportunity to show their stuff!

Exams remain an important component in learning, since they give the opportunity for students not only to demonstrate what they've learned throughout the year, but to develop organisational skills, by budgeting enough time to study and develop understandings, skills and confidence. Exams are also a brilliant opportunity for young people to learn to take a chunk of a day or a whole day off during study break sometimes to give themselves some time to soak in what's been learned and turn the brain off a bit. If it's a beautiful day and a student wants to be outside and not at a desk, then they can take their notes to the park and enjoy a picnic while they study. All of these are valuable lessons that students can carry with them for the rest of their lives. Students are encouraged to take exams seriously, but that should motivate them to study and prepare for them in advance which will help to keep them from feeling sick and worried. Exam prep time is also an opportunity to get in the habit of taking a bit of time out for yourself before the exam too, and if possible find a quiet place to sit and mentally prepare even just for five minutes. Hopefully, the exam period just gone has provided opportunities for learners to put these ideas into practice. . .if more practice is required, for our Year 10's, 11's and 12's and for our year 13's moving further study, there's always Above all, the message from all of the experts is that although we place value on exams - turning up, preparing well, doing your best - it's important to remember that these results will not define the rest of anyone's life. If the young person in your life is feeling stressed about waiting to see how they performed on exams in 2022, encourage them to develop some perspective. In a year's time, it is very likely that these results will have vanished from memory, and a new set of stresses will have replaced the ones being

experienced at present!
As we put the "QUIET EXAMS" signs away for another year, we express our appreciation for all of the effort that students and their caregivers have put into making the three week NCEA exam period in 2022 a success at Tokomairiro High School, and we look forward to even bigger and better things in 2023!

# **NASA Astronaut Inspires**

On Thursday 3rd November, ten of our Year 7-10 students were fortunate enough to attend a special opportunity to listen to NASA Astronaut, Dr Shannon Walker, speak about her experience with Space Travel.

Dr. Walker's first space flight was in 2010, a long-duration mission on the International Space Station (ISS). She served as the pilot on the Soyuz spacecraft that took her and her crew to the ISS and served as a Flight Engineer on the Station for Expeditions 24 and 25. That mission lasted 163 days, with 161 of them on the ISS. Her second mission was also a long-duration flight on the ISS. This time she was a Mission Specialist on the SpaceX Crew Dragon Crew-1 vehicle named Resilience, which launched in November 2020. She was a Flight Engineer on the ISS during Expedition 64 and was the ISS Commander for Expedition 65 until her crew returned to Earth in May of

2021. This mission totalled 167





days. She spoke about her three year journey of training and preparation prior to her first flight in 2010, and what life was like living and working on the Space Station. She had an amazing slideshow of images of what she could see daily from her window on the Space Station looking back towards earth. It was interesting to hear how she still could maintain up to date communication with friends and family on Earth. She has had an exciting career and was keen to get back up

# Options being assessed for Clutha District's rural water schemes

An assessment of Clutha District's rural water supplies is underway, looking at how the schemes could operate in the future.

Council and the rural water schemes working party are working with the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) and an independent assessment, funded by the DIA, is being undertaken by Morrison Low. The assessment will look at the benefits, costs and risks of customer-ownership versus water services entity ownership and operation.

Under the Government's Three Waters Reform Programme all council-owned and operated drinking water, wastewater and stormwater services will be transferred to four new water services entities on 1 July 2024. After this date, councils will no longer have direct roles in managing and operating three water services.

Clutha District has 11 rural water schemes that provide water for farm use and domestic consumption.

A number of townships in the district are connected to these schemes, including Kaka Point, Waihola, Clinton, Tokoiti, Tuapeka Mouth, Waitahuna, Heriot, Pukerau and Waikaka.

Over the next few months, work will include discussions between Council, DIA, farmers, scheme chairs and contractors to ensure the work is factual and practical.

Results of the work will be made publicly available and will help to determine whether an owner operated scheme is a viable option. The assessment will also inform three waters legislation to be fully enacted in mid-2023.
