# Hockey at SISS Tournament Week - Ashburton 2022

Last week the Toko Boys 1<sup>st</sup> XI Hockey team traveled to Ashburton to compete in the Secondary School's tournament week. The week before they left the team had finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Division 2 of the Dunedin competition, which equals Toko's best result

We travelled up to Ashburton on Sunday, with a wee excursion into Omauru to visit SteamPunk. There were 16 teams in the Ashburton competition, eight boys and eight girls teams. In the boy's section, we were divided into two pools of four. Ashburton only has one turf, so with eight games a day to get through the first game started at 8am and the final started at 5.20pm.

Toko's Monday game was against Rolleston, which was one of the tournament favourites. Toko had a narrow 2-1 loss. Next up on Tuesday was the West coast which Toko won 6-2. Although the score looks comfortable Toko scored three of those goals in the last five minutes. The last of the pool games were against Middleton where Toko had a 2-3 loss. This put Toko in the bottom four play-offs for 5 & 8<sup>th</sup> position. Toko's semi-final was against Ashburton which we won 2-0. The final on Friday was against Waitaki Boys who had beaten Toko in the semi-final last time Toko had been

Toko wanted to return the favour, which we did beating Waitaki Boys 1-0. The goal was scored in the first ¼ and it was a pretty tense game as both teams tried to make the game theirs. So Toko claimed 5<sup>th</sup> place. Toko was also 2<sup>nd</sup> equal with most goals scored for the team with Lachie sharing 1<sup>st</sup> place with most individual goals on four.

It was a great week and the boys hockey improved throughout the week, especially the younger players. While we lose four of the Year 13 boy's (Nic C, Seth, Nova, and Alex) the younger players have really stepped up and Toko boys hockey looks as strong as ever for next year. It was a great week all-round - a great experience and a real buzz on the way home having won our final game.

The hut is located in the small town of Otematata. It's bright yellow with an old iron roof and window seals which are as white as paper. It has a number of windows facing every direction, allowing it to absorb heat in the summer.

Overgrown bushes shield the house from the road making it look like a jungle. Rabbit holes cover the whole yard with little to no grass growing at all in the summer. There's a junky old shed filled to the brim with kayaks, windsurfing gear, and even an old car that hasn't run in a year. The couch, which has seen over half the family sit on it, and two tired pieces of furniture in the living room, are covered in a rainbow-like fabric. The kitchen has a line of bananacoloured cabinets with white door handles. Opposite the cabinets, is the tabletop with a white finish; the oven is settled nicely amongst the banana-coloured cabinets while the fridge sits nestled in the corner. From the kitchen, a long hallway leads to the bedroom; it is a simple box-shaped room with just two power outlets on each side, and the bed is dead in the centre making you feel enclosed in the room. The walls are covered in badly peeling wallpaper that once had beautiful golden flowers.

Outside, the lake is just down the road which in summer is chockablock full of boats, with people gliding across the water on skis or biscuits. When boats disappear, the fishermen thrive in the fading light trying to catch one in a million. Mountain bikers cruise down the valley and beside the lake, bouncing down the trails made of earth and rock, stopping only to take a break and exchange words. The lake breeze blows lightly along the trail with the sun beating down on their backs.

The feeling of stress vanishes with the relaxing atmosphere that is created while being there. You can do amazing walks that take you towering towards the sky overlooking the crystal clear waters where thousands of willows line the banks overhanging the water. When you start your descent, darting down the trails, you will see incredible lavender and bleached-coloured flowers.

Whether inside or outside, I'm always going to enjoy being in Otematata and adding to the memories I've gathered there.




